Self-loading balers

Baler and wrapper in one machine

McHale Specialized Farm Machinery, a family-run business based in Ballinrobe, County Mayo, Ireland, and distributed by Edney Distributing in the United States, has introduced the McHale Fusion 3 Integrated Baler. With increased demand from farmers and contractors to reduce operating costs, the Fusion 3 combines two traditionally separate jobs, baling and bale wrapping, into one single operation performed by one person and one machine.

The wrapper consists of an 18-roller fixed chamber baler and integrated vertical wrapping ring. Features for the new baler wrappers include new machine guards that give operators better access and add a more modern look and new platform and handrails for easier access to the net system. A door-lock tap is located outside the panels on the main platform for operator convenience along with improved net storage on the main platform. The baler wrapper also features a heavy-duty watershield PTO with star tubing and heavy-duty crosses and a five-tine bar pick up that the company says gives 25% better ground cleaning and crop transfer.

More aggressive cutting and better shredding

John Deere has introduced the HX6 and HX7 Rotary Cutters, replacing the JD609 and JD709 machines. The new rotary cutters feature a new, industry-exclusive double-deck design and a deeper cutting chamber that improve overall performance, according to the release.

The double-deck design prevents water and debris from collecting on top of the unit because the upper deck is domed. Water, grass and crop debris tend to roll off the deck, reducing water buildup and deck rust. The domed shape and smooth profile make the deck easier to clean if trash builds up in adverse conditions, according to a company specialist.

The rotary cutters have a variable cutting height of 2 inches (in.) to 9 in. and come in two cutting widths: 6 feet (ft.) and 7 ft. The gearbox is rated at 150 continuous and 210 peak hp and the blade pan inclusion offers more protection to the gearbox. With an operating speed of five mph, the rotary cutters have the ability to cut materials up to 3 in. in diameter.

The machines have a three-point clevis-type hitch and have been improved for easier height adjustment. A forward tip adjustment allows the cutter to be tilted forward slightly, so most of the cutting occurs in the front while the shredding action takes place toward the rear of the machine.
