The live auction, hosted by Col.

Kevin Wendt, grossed an impressive \$36,000 in general support for the Angus Foundation. The nine lots included: the 19,000,000th American Angus Association registration number, four granite pavers, a Lathrop Livestock Transportation package, a Henry "Big Boy" rifle, a

Dorchester Plantation quail hunt and a Jorgensen Land & Cattle pheasant hunt package.

To round out the evening's festivities, two generous donations were made to the Angus Foundation. Curtis and Ann Long of Briarwood Angus Farms, Butler, Mo., announced an outright unrestricted cash gift of \$40,000, and the Ohio Junior Angus Association announced an \$80,000 gift to the National Junior Angus Show (NIAS) Endowment Fund.
