One overall winner will be selected by a panel of qualified

judges. The winner will serve as a spokesperson for the Angus industry and will be the Association's nominee for the subsequent National Cattlemen's Beef Association (NCBA) Environmental Stewardship Award.

The *Angus Journal* will feature the winner's conservation practices in the November 2002 issue. The winner also will be recognized at the American Angus Association Annual Banquet in Louisville, Ky., scheduled in conjunction with the North American International Livestock Exposition (NAILE) in November.
