## Bridge builders

Have you ever taken a particularly long bridge?

I remember driving across the Mackinac Bridge about six years ago between the upper peninsula and mitten of Michigan. In addition to our scholarship programs for involved junior Angus members, we're proud to offer our commercial cattlemen scholarship program. This program is available for youth from commercial herds who have purchased registered Angus sires or dams and transferred to them in the past three years. Be sure to encourage your customers with children to apply.

One misnomer about our scholarship program is that it only applies towards the cost of a four-year institution. In fact, we're proud to award many scholarships for students enrolled in community colleges and technical schools.

As with any programs funded by the Angus Foundation, these

scholarships are made possible through the generosity of endowment fund donors and Angus Fund donors.

If you know a young person, encourage them to apply. Also, be on the lookout for "office hours" we will be hosting to assist them in polishing up their applications by making suggestions and helping them avoid common mistakes we see. These sessions will be a valuable resource, and we hope to work with many young professionals during these one-on-one sessions.

Whether it is pursuing a degree, sharpening leadership skills, or making new friends, your gifts to the Angus Foundation are a vital link for youth to find encouragement to cultivate a career in our breed and industry. Thank you for building bridges!
