Erdmann Heifer Captures \$20,000 for Juniors

The tremendously successful sale of this year's Angus Foundation donation heifer can be credited to a committed group of Angus enthusiasts who really believe in the future of the Angus breed.

Erdmann Angus Ranch, Wetonka, S.D., donated an especially popular March 1982 daughter of Dr Spock. R&J Ranch, Briggs, Texas, generously provided their embryo transfer facilities along with breeding privileges to Perryville Esso Extra 17M and R&J Austin 13. Harding & Harding, Geneva, Ill., agreed to insure the heifer for 30 days, and to top it off, the owners of High Voltage and Direct Current also offered breeding privileges.

When Leroy Van Dyke's gavel fell for the last time, George Becker (owner of Blue Top Angus, Enderlin, N.D., and a long-time supporter of youth activities) was the buyer at \$20,000. A group of Kentucky breeders, headed by Floyd Dievert, Blue Grass, Ky. were contending bidders.

The Angus Foundation is a non-profit organization that supports youth activities, education and research while being the primary funding source for the National Junior Angus Assn.

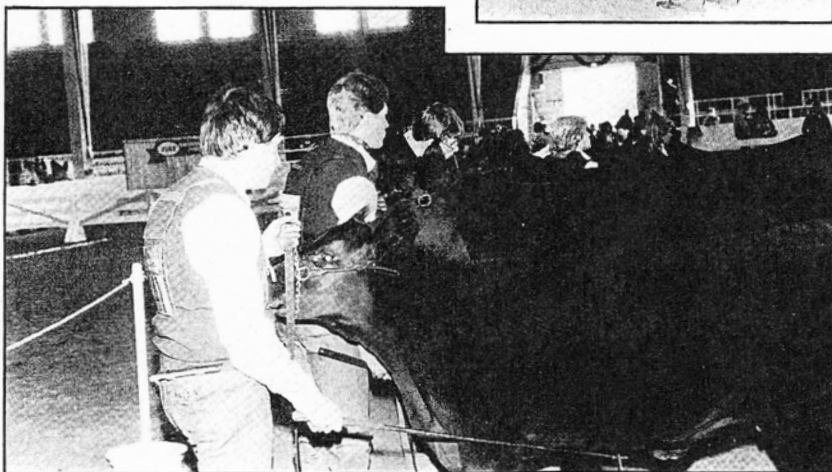

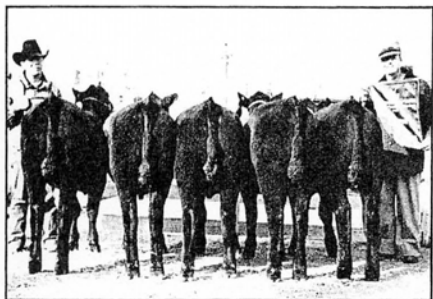

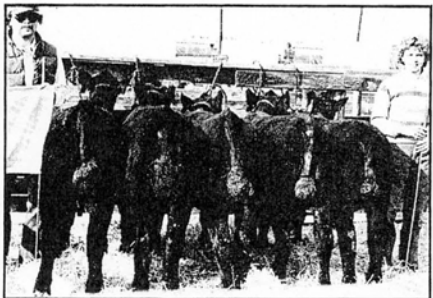
BLACK DOMINATED

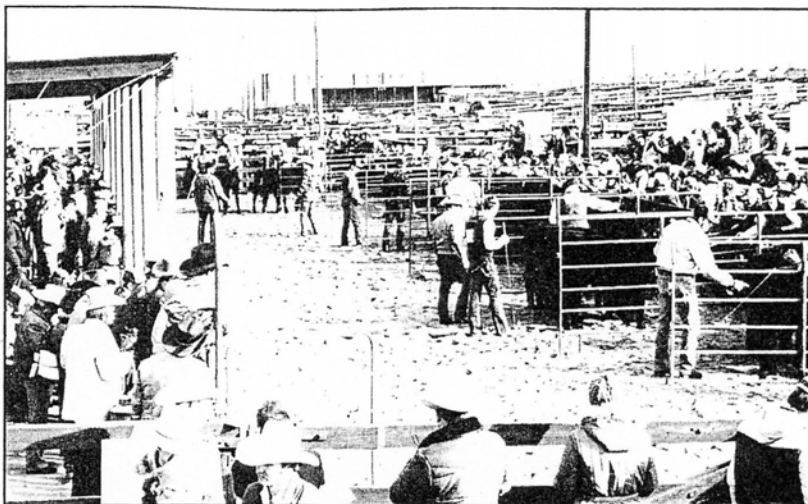

Black was the predominant color in a strong feeder steer show—both grand and reserve pens were Angus-Chianina crosses. Glen Klippenstein, Maysville, Mo.; Samuel Moore, Harrison, Neb.; and Gerald Robbe, Pueblo, Colo., did the judging.

Angus Crosses Swept Carcass Competition

Angus crosses dominated the National Western fed beef competition as well as on-hoof steer and feeder championships. The five Angus-Charolais cross steers entered by Lind Farms, Eaton, Colo., claimed the group of carcasses grand championship. The carcasses averaged 760 lb., .43 inches fat cover, 15.15 square inch loin eye area, 2.01 yield grade and low choice quality grade.

The champion Angus steers were shown by Greg Hartman, Pueblo, Colo. Carcasses of those steers averaged 770 lb., .45 inch fat cover, 13.8 square inch loin eye area, 2.6 yield grade and low choice quality grade.

Champion Angus heifer carcasses were entered by Harry and Wayne Schnorr, Fort Collins, Colo., and averaged 697 lb., .52 inch fat cover, 13.46 square inch loin eye area and 2.42 yield grade, with quality grades of low prime (two) and choice (three).



Vance Uden of TC Ranch, Franklin, Neb., lined up two first place pens in the yards and earned the reserve grand champion banner with a group of Dr Spock calves.



Ringside spots came at a premium by the time champions were selected. Thousands of Angus enthusiasts were on hand to celebrate the American Angus Assn.'s 100th year and those in the stands represented all sectors of the country.

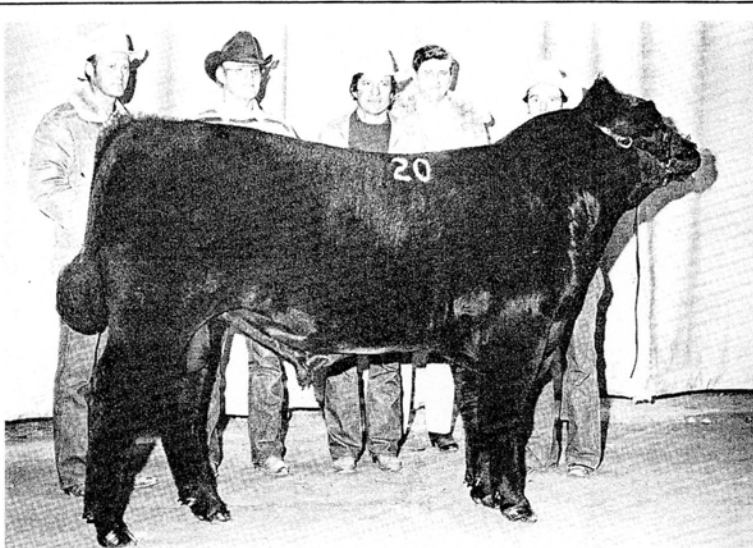


Grand Champion Sale Bull

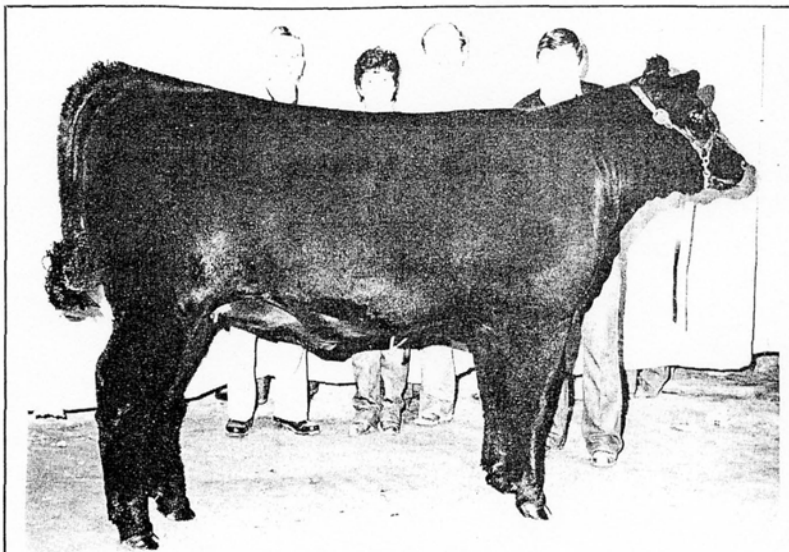

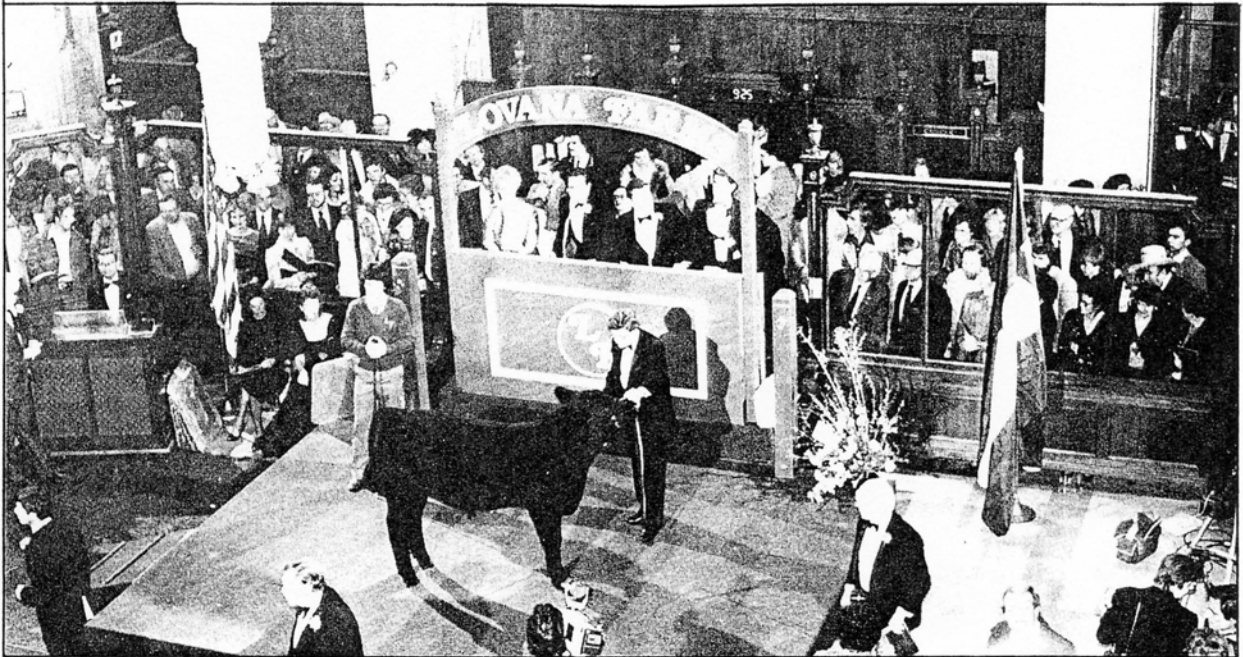

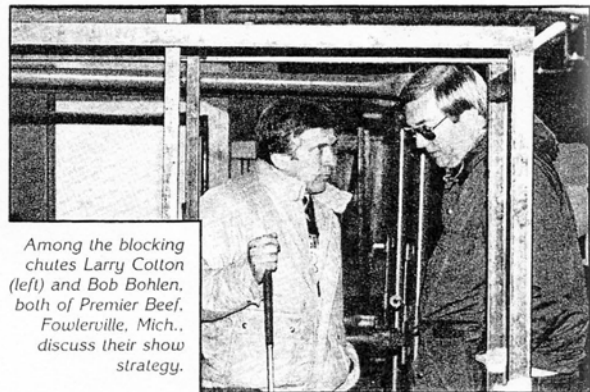
MORE IN DENVER . . .

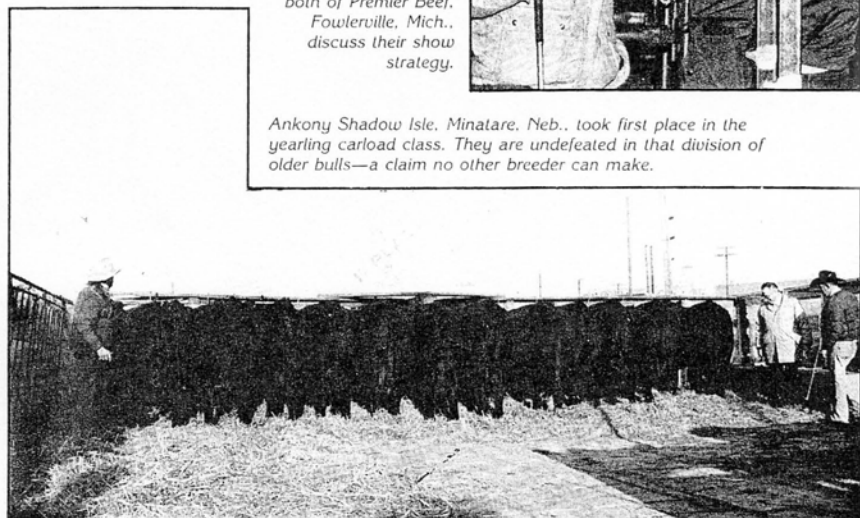
