#### Grand Champion Sale Bull **HF** Imprint

After earning the grand champion slap from judge Steve Simmons on Thursday afternoon, this senior bull calf winner earned a \$9,000 bid Friday from a Canadian operation.

The 10-9-83 Premier Independence KN son out of HF Enchantress 167 (a Columbus Adventure 310 daughter in the Huntingdon herd) weighed in at 1,234 lb. and already boasts of several Eastern show wins. Last summer he was bull calf champion of the Virginia Angus Breeders' Show and the Virginia State Fair, then collected the light purple at the Eastern National Livestock Show and the Pennsylvania Angus Breeders' Show.

he time was new. The place was new. And a few new twists spiced up the action, too. The result? An overflow crowd, lots of excitement and impressive averages from all angles.

When the final gavel fell at this year's National Western Angus Sale, 49 lots had grossed over \$400,000 to average \$8,354, up nearly \$4,000 from last year's solid mark. Five flushes and special matings-including future offspring from the recently crowned grand and reserve grand champions of the National Angus Show -led the tally with an \$18,000 average, followed by nine embryos at \$12,000, 29 bulls at \$6,116 and six females at \$5,500.

Sponsored by the American Angus Assn., but co-managed for the first time with the American Angus Hall of Fame, this year's sale took on a new look. It was held in the Beef Palace Auction Arena (rather than the Stadium Arena, as in past years) immediately after the female show. Bulls were judged by Steve Simmons of Omega Farms, Williamston, Mich., Thursday morning. The timing was an improvement and the location reduced distractions, but there was a problem -space. Even though folks filled each seat, covered every step and stood several rows deep in the aisles, the crowd still oozed out into the stall area.

It seems plenty of buyers were able to find a spot in the arena, though. Auctioneer Craig Conover kept the action rolling, cracking off a long string of five-figure prices and scattering the royally-bred offering across North America.






### Reserve Grand Champion Sale Bull and High-Selling Bull **SVF General George**




