

National Angus Bull Sale

The National Angus Bull Sale hosted during Cattlemen's Congress grossed \$632,300.

Angus breeders consigned 47 bulls to the 83rd annual National Angus Bull Sale Jan. 7 in Oklahoma City, Okla. The sale, hosted by the American Angus Association during Cattlemen's Congress, grossed \$632,300 and averaged \$13,453.

The high-selling lot, Crouch Home Town 105, was consigned by Crouch Angus Valley, Glenwood, Iowa. The February 2021 son of G A R Home Town sold for \$175,000 and was purchased by TK Angus, Wood Lake, Neb.; Brumfield Angus, Three Oaks, Mich.; Wilks Ranch Texas Ltd, Cisco, Texas; RCA Cattle Company, Nebraska City, Neb.; GW Genetics, Billings, Mont.; Gutwein Angus, Francesville, Ind.; Genetic Pathways, Lowell, Ind.; Marda Farms, Lodi, Wis.; and Double Barrel Angus, Thompson Station, Tenn.

Roseda Farm, Monkton, Md., consigned the second high-seller, Roseda Powerplant H152, an October 2020 bull sired by Roseda Powerball23 F091. Alta Genetics USA, Watertown, Wis., purchased the lot for \$70,000.

Other high-selling bulls included FAR Home Town 1013, consigned by Frey Angus Ranch, Granville, N.D. The January 2021 son of G A R Home Town was purchased by Select Sires, Plain City, Ohio, for \$27,500.

EXAR Valiant 0783B was consigned by Express Ranches, Yukon, Okla. Cunningham Ranch, Amber, Okla., purchased the August 2020 son of Hoover No Doubt for \$27,000.

High Roller Angus, Center, Texas, consigned HR Growth Fund 0131. Alta Genetics USA, Watertown, Wis., purchased the September 2020 son of Deer Valley Growth Fund for \$23,000.
