

National Angus Bull Sale Kicks Off Spring Sales

Thirty-four Angus bulls sold in Oklahoma City for an averaged \$15,620.

Spring sale season is underway with the 84th annual National Angus Bull Sale setting the pace. Angus breeders consigned 34 bulls to the sale, hosted by the American Angus Association during Cattlemen's Congress, Jan. 6 in Oklahoma City, Okla., which grossed \$531,100 and averaged \$15,620.

"There were really some frontend genetics that were featured in this platform, and the cattle sold extremely well," says Jeff Mafi, Association regional manager. "There'll be a lot of good genetics offered this spring, and I look forward to working with our seedstock providers and our commercial customers, but I anticipate a real strong sale season."

High-selling lots

The high-selling lot, BNWZ 8'72 1202, was consigned by Barry Nowatzke, Michigan City, Ind. The

October 2021 son of Wilks 8'72 sold for \$110,000 and was purchased by Double Barrel Angus, Thomson Station, Tenn.; and Encore Cattle, Rosenburg, Texas.

Express Angus Ranches, Yukon, Okla., consigned the second highseller, EXAR Crossroads 1820B, an October 2021 bull sired by SG Salvation. Grimmius Cattle Company, Hanford, Calif., purchased the lot for \$83,000.
