Hill" under show judge Ralph Clark, Plymouth, California, and another 114 head of bulls were displayed in the pen and carload division of the show. Judging the pens and carloads were Bill Bradley, Memphis, Texas; Howard Hillman, Canova, South Dakota; and Sam Wagner, Harlan Kansas.

For Grand Champion Bull of the show, judge Clark slapped the Intermediate Champion entered by Ken-Caryl Ranch, Littleton, Colorado, and Angus International. North Platte, Nebraska. The bull was Ken Caryl Mr Angus 8017.








