Submit AHIR records by June 1

June 1 is the deadline for submitting performance records to the American Angus Association for the fall 2001 *Sire Evaluation Report*. Information received after June 1 will not be included in the fall analysis. If you have questions, contact the Performance Programs Department.

When you submit your herd's performance records, they become part of the world's largest database of individual beef cattle records. The database helps both purebred and commercial producers select genetics for their herds. If you are not enrolled in the Angus Herd Improvement Records (AHIR) program, contact the Performance Programs Department to learn how it can benefit your herd and the entire Angus breed.

Nominate state delegates now

It's time to nominate delegates to represent your state at the 2001 Association Annual Meeting set for Nov. 12 in Louisville, Kv.

Each Association member may make one nomination. All eligible nominations will be included on a state ballot that will be mailed to members for the final selection of delegates. Nominations must be received by June 30. You already should have received a nomination petition in the mail.

It's important to nominate a person who

is willing to attend the Annual Meeting and who is informed about the Angus business. That person could be you. If that's the case, don't hesitate to nominate yourself.

If you're new to the Angus breed, make plans to attend the Annual Meeting and to learn more about the business of your Association. The event is conducted during the North American International Livestock Exposition (NAILE).

Explore Angus online services

Several features have been added to the Association Web site (*www.angus.org*) in the past few months, including a member logon. The logon allows active regular, life and junior members to create a password-protected profile to which they can log in and view their registered herd inventory, artificial insemination (AI) certificate inventory, expected progeny difference (EPD) data and more.

The member lookup feature allows members to search for other Association members by member code, name, city, state or ZIP code. You also can submit a change of address via this feature.

The EPD/pedigree lookup allows members to search the Association database of more than 13 million registered Angus cattle to see the pedigree and EPDs of any registered animal. The user also can search by registration number or name and follow a

link to the animal's pedigree to see previous generations.

A gestation calculator also is available, and the user can enter a specific service date to get the calf's due date, or enter a calf's due date to get the service date. It also features a complete table of service dates with corresponding due dates.

Several searches, including the current *Sire Evaluation Report*, listings on the Angus Resource Clearinghouse Network (ARCNet) and the Bull Listing Service (BLS), are popular features for both members and commercial producers.

Questions about these features should be directed to the Information Systems (IS) Department.

Nebraska to host national conference

The 2001 National Angus Conference and Tour is set for Oct. 1-3 in North Platte, Neb. The Nebraska Angus Association will host the two-day tour Oct. 1-2, which will feature stops at purebred, commercial and feeding operations. A one-day conference program, featuring speakers from all areas of the beef industry, will conclude the event on Oct. 3.

An addition to this year's event will be a "Basics of the Business Breed" program on Sunday, Sept. 30. It will include sessions on the Angus Information Management Software (AIMS), Web marketing, and other Association programs and services.

MAY 1 ...

- NJAA Honorary Angus Foundation nominations. This honor goes to individuals who have shown extraordinary interest in and support of junior members and junior activities. Up to three people may be honored each year. Send nominations to the Junior Activities Department.
- Advisor of the Year nominations. This award honors the dedication and contributions of those who advise junior Angus associations, and it may go to an individual or a couple. Any junior Angus association may nominate. Contact the Junior Activities Department.
- Ownership deadline for the Eastern Regional and the Northwest Regional Preview.

MAY 15 ...

- Entry deadline for the Eastern Regional and Northwest Regional Preview. Entries must be postmarked on or before May 15. No exceptions
- Angus Foundation scholarship applications. The Angus Foundation is offering college scholarships totaling \$20,000: two for \$2,500 and 15 for \$1,000. Call the Junior Activities Department for more information or an application. Applications also are available on the Internet at www.angus.org.
- Certified Angus Beef LLC (CAB)/NJAA Scholarship applications. CAB and the NJAA offer a \$1,000 scholarship. Current junior members, or life or regular members who at one time were NJAA members, are eligible to apply if they also are college sophomores, juniors or seniors majoring in animal science, meat science, food science, agricultural communications or a related field of study. - National Junior Angus Show ownership deadline. To be eligible to show, animals must be transferred to the junior exhibitor on or before this date. Late transfers are not accepted. Entry deadline is June 1. No exceptions.
