## **Photography Contest Returns**

Photography helps capture a moment in time, so it can be studied or enjoyed for years to come. The National Junior Angus Association (NJAA) and the *Angus Journal* staff don't typically have to worry about the comings and goings of superheroes, but they still know the power of an image.

It's this power that serves as the foundation for the NJAA/Angus Journal Photography Contest. The event is designed to help young Angus breeders perfect another communication skill as they use their creative minds to convey a message or feeling with the use of a camera.

Junior, intermediate and senior members can enter in four separate categories: Angus Cattle, Angus People, Angus Landscape, and Around the Farm or Ranch. Overall photos will be selected from the categories, and top photos will be recognized from each age division and the overall contest.



## Important details

A panel of qualified judges selected by the American Angus Association will critique the images submitted. Evaluations are made 60% on creativity (communication power, composition, etc.) and 40% on technical quality (proper light exposure, true color, sharp focus, correct cropping, etc.).

The top 3 winners of each category in each age division will receive a custom print of their winning photo. All photos will be displayed at the National Junior Angus Show (NJAS), and winners will be recognized at the awards ceremony set for July 7. As space allows, top images will also be printed in the *Angus Journal*'s coverage of the NJAS in the September issue.
