The winning intermediate team in the steak division is awarded the Pat Grote LEAD Award that pays the registration fee for team members to attend the Leaders Engaged in Angus Development (LEAD) conference in the year of the win or the year after. The Ardyce's Apron Award was created to recognize the overall topranked junior team.

The Crystal Award is awarded to the top male and female contestant for placings in all educational contests. The Silver Pitcher Award is presented to the

top male and female for their show ring achievements.

The Richard L. Spader Award is presented to the senior extemporaneous speaking winner. Winners of the intermediate extemporaneous speaking division receive a beautiful Rattey sculpture as the Pat Grote Award.

The Auxiliary awards a silver Revere bowl to the top five showmen in the coveted Showmanship Contest.

Our Scholarship Committee carefully evaluates the applications submitted and awards scholarships annually at NJAS to five males and females.

We would be remiss if we didn't look outside of the NJAS and focus on achievements at all levels. The Certificate of Achievement is awarded to qualifying juniors for outstanding achievements at the national, state and district levels.
