Georgia to Host 1997 National Junior Angus Show

Oung Angus enthusiasts from all across the United States will be making their way to Perry, Ga., July 14-19 for the 1997 National Junior Angus Show. "Georgia On My Mind" is the theme the Georgia Junior Angus Association has selected for the event, which has grown to be the largest

single-breed beef cattle show in the world. It will be held at the Georgia National Fairgrounds and Agricenter.

A big helping of southern hospitality will be served up for exhibitors from more than 30 states who are expected to participate in the five-day event.

Finals of the 31st National Junior Angus Showmanship Contest will be held during the week. Approximately 70 contestants will compete for the coveted title of "Top Showman."

In addition to the livestock competitions, leadership contests and educational seminars will be held, including a new quiz bowl, for NJAA members.


The annual meeting of the National Junior Angus Association (NJAA) will be conducted during the show with the election of six new directors to the NJAA Board. A public speaking contest, which includes both prepared and extemporaneous divisions, and a team sales competition will take place, as well as the All-American *Certified Angus Beef* ™ Cook-Off, poster and state scrapbook contests. Entries from the 1997 NJAA photography contest will also be on display.

Along with serious competition, there are many fun events and mixers. A Barnyard Olympics and a social/dance for both junior members and adults are planned this year in Perry.

Exhibitors must be a junior member of the American Angus Association, and be nine years old by Jan. 1, 1997, and not yet be 21 years of age by that date to compete.

Cook-Off Kicks Off Show July 15

Entries are now being taken for the 14th All-American *Certified Angus Beef* ™ Cook-Off. This event, coordinated by the American Angus Auxiliary and NJAA. will begin at 2:30 p.m. on Tuesday, July 15. It will be held at Georgia National Fairground's Roquemore Conference Center.

Cook-Off teams will be divided into four age divisions: 9-13, 14-17, 18-21 and over 21 (adult division). A total presentation award will be given along with prizes for top winners in the regular recipe and showmanship categories.

Buckhead Beef, Atlanta, Ga., will supply the *Certified Angus Beef* cuts for Cook-Off contestants. The Georgia Beef Board will donate grills.

NJAA Seeks Donations for Silent Auction




The auction is a fund raiser for the Angus Foundation, which supports educational programs and activities for National Junior Angus Association (NJAA) members.

Area Attractions

Georgia National Fairgrounds & Agricenter

— This 628-acre site features Reaves Arena, a state-of-the-art center custom designed for livestock and horse shows, concerts, meetings, trade shows and sporting events. The Fairgrounds is a state-owned multi-purpose complex open all year and designed to promote agriculture, youth activities and food science. It's completely handicapped accessible. All buildings are enclosed by a fence with 24-hour security. Up to 1,000 recreational vehicles can be accommodated.

Located at Perry, just off I-75 at exit 42.

Downtown Perry — Old Perry's renovated downtown area is a charming old Williamsburg village with specialty shops and a down-South, restful atmosphere. The Perry Antique Trail is a place to find special treasures. There is also a state Antique Trail that is a 200-mile loop, beginning and ending in Perry. Stop at the Welcome Center for more information.

Massee Lane Gardens — Stroll along brick pathways through nine acres of camellias under towering pines. Enjoy a garden greenhouse, Japanese Koi pond and a rose gazebo. Featured flowers and plants include azaleas, dogwoods, narcissus, iris, daylilies, Banksial roses and, of

course, the most beautiful camellias in the world.

Directions from Perry: From exit 42, take U.S. Highway 341 to Fort Valley. Then take Highway 49 south toward Marshallville. Watch for Massee Lane Gardens signs on the left.

Andersonville National Historic Site -

Abundantly rich in history, the monument includes 13,669 graves in the Andersonville National Cemetery, prisoner of war memorials, a partial reconstruction of the Confederate Camp Sumpter prison stockade and a Civil War museum. Also be sure to visit the Civil War Village of Andersonville, Pioneer Farm and Drummer Boy Museum.

Directions from Perry: Take Highway 224 through Montezuma to Oglethorpe. Then take Highway 49 south. Look for Andersonville National Historic Site signs.

Andersonville Trail — This scenic, historic 75-mile loop from Perry south to Andersonville, Plains and Cordele, is a truly Southern experience. Travel through quaint Antebellum and Victorian towns, as well as through the picturesque rural countryside tilled with pecan and peach orchards.
