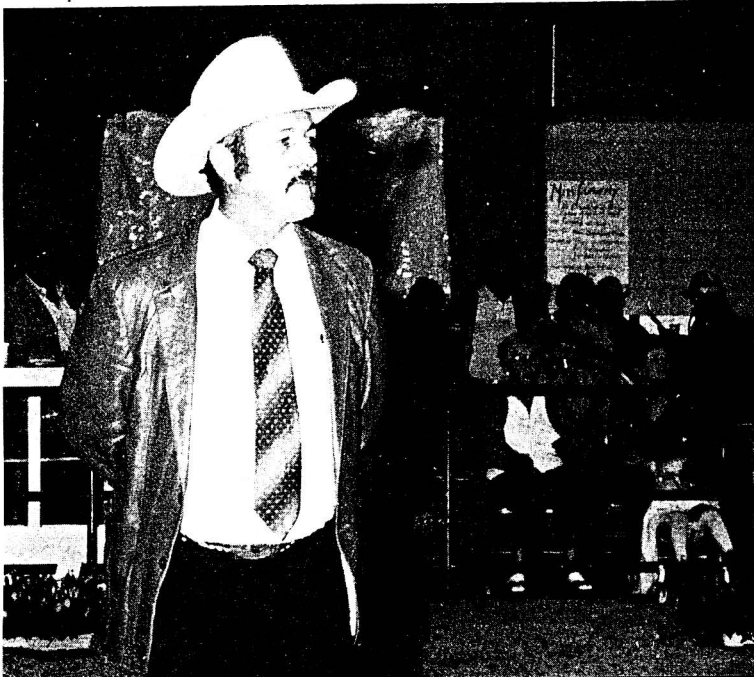

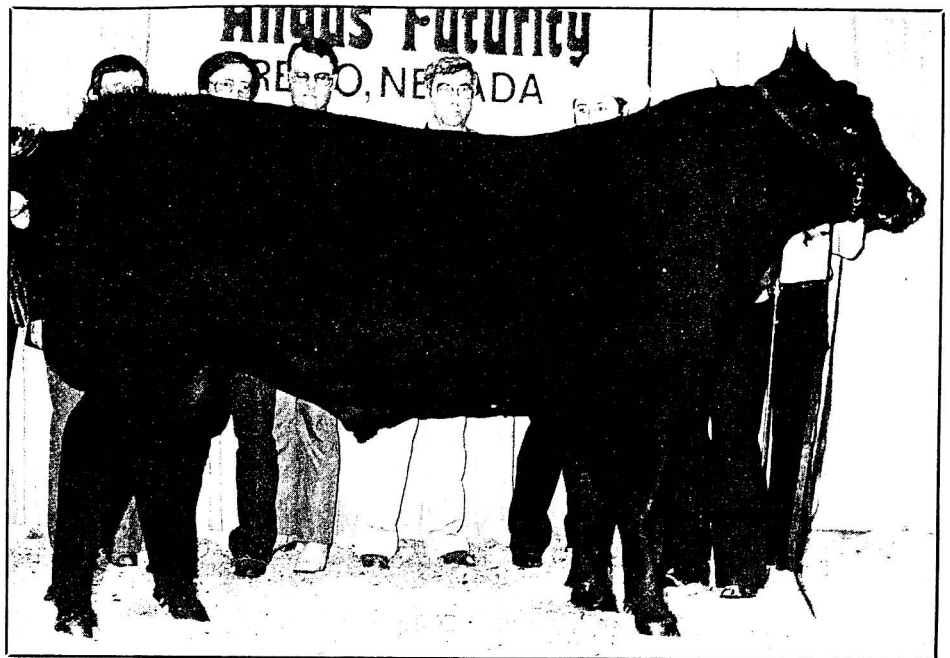
Western National Angus Futurity



The hosting Western States Angus Assn. always adds a little razzle-dazzle to events in Reno, making this quite a unique national Angus show every year. Spotlighted championship selections, ladies' day nonsense and much socializing accented the usual good times in Reno's relaxed, fun-loving atmosphere. A broad cross-section of Angus breeders enjoyed themselves to the hilt . . . but they were also there to study the decisions of judge Ralph Clark, Plymouth, Calif.

In all, 77 heifers and 58 bulls vied for Clark's final selections. Contenders included veterans with lengthy win lists as well as rookies anxious to build reputations. Competition was strong and, as Tuesday's spotlight highlighted the final rounds, Clark looked past several strong track records to youngsters in both lineups. He slapped his junior heifer calf winner Princess Jamie 1R as grand champion in the female division, following with reserve junior calf champion Windac Tiara F460. Among the bulls, intermediate champion SVF Pistolero captured top honors and junior calf champion Harrison beat out older competition for the reserve grand champion silver.

Princess Jamie 1R, a 4-14-83 daughter of RCT Machinist owned by Brad Worthington, Princeville, Ill., made an impressive debut this year in Denver where she stood as reserve in the junior heifer calf division to her closest Reno rival, "Tiara."

"Tiara," full-sib and flush mate to her reserve grand champion counterpart in the bull show, is a 5-4-83 daughter of Dr Spock. (Their dam Windac Class 1742 stepped up from junior calf champion to the grand championship in Reno two years ago.) The heifer is owned by Windy Acres Angus, Harrison, Neb.; B&L Ranches, Shawnee, Okla.; and Bert Skou, Buenos Aires, Argentina.

In the race for their glory these youngsters beat out favorites such as TC Peggy Lee 3001, TC Peggy Sue 2135, QLC A51 Camilla A300P, and QLC A51 Erica L790P.

Reno's top banner was the first for SVF Pistolero, too. The 6-13-82 son of Ken Caryl Mr. Angus 8017 out of Blackbird of SVF 0370 was bred by Sunny Valley Farms, Yorkville, Ill.; they share ownership now with Quirk Land & Cattle Co. and TJR Angus, both of Hastings, Neb. Selection of the grand champion bull climaxed three days of competition, and Clark's final decision came as a surprise to many. SVF Pistolero traveled a fast track to hoard a lion's share of the plentiful silver trophies. He took on the likes of Omegan Royal to claim his divisional title, then overpowered up-and-coming Harrison, 4S Ponderosa and High Profit FAR as well as the added age and



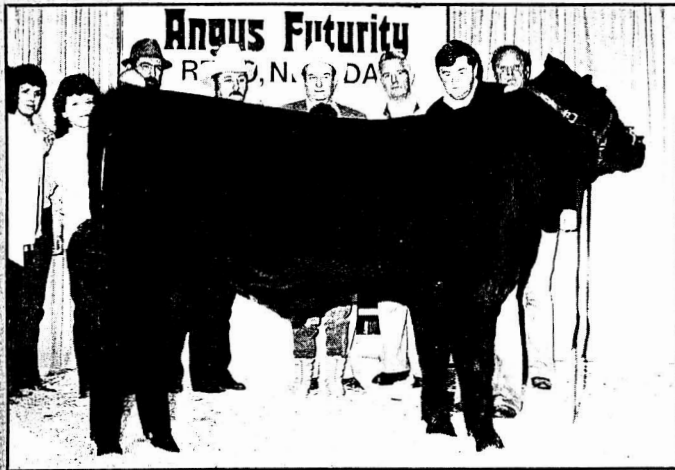
GRAND CHAMPION HEIFER

pounds of Cracker Jack Brutus 512 and Mr Atom GV for the final slap.

Harrison's win boosted spirits of Windy Acres, B&L and Skou—owners who also had a piece of his popular sister—and widened the smiles in the camp of co-owner Belle Point Ranch, Lavaca, Ark. The winning pair teamed up with TC Peggy Lee 3001 to claim the junior get class for those folks and TC Ranch, Franklin, Neb.; Northcote Angus, Forest, Va.; and Kyanite Angus Farms, Madisonville, Va. TC Ranch then added TC Peggy Sue 2135, a full sister of "Peggy Lee," to the group to win the get-of-sire class.

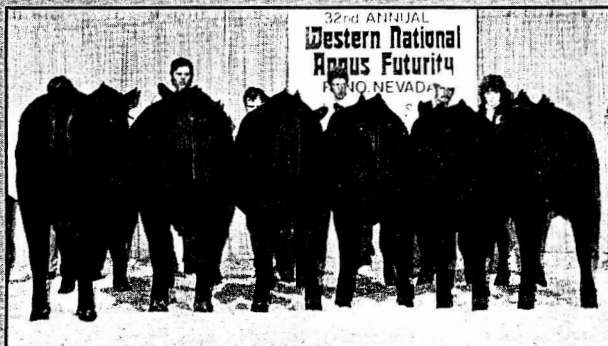

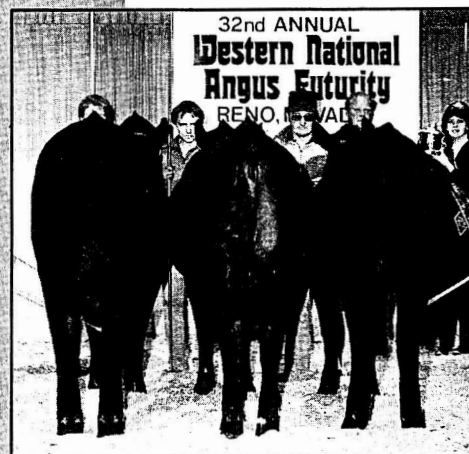

Champion bull in the sweepstakes competition was TM Fool Proof 3X1, a Kruegers Foolish Pride son that later stood second in class to Harrison for owners Randel & Debra Nelson, Ansley, Neb.; S/2 Angus Ranch, Pt. Reyes, Calif.; and Huckfeldt-Krebs, Gordon, Neb. The sweepstakes division includes animals nominated prior to their birth. (In other words, a "mating" is nominated.) Winners share in the jackpot premiums on a percentage basis.

And then there's always the unique and entertaining "Ladies' Day Extravaganza." This year featured a special "That's Angus Credible" conglomeration (for lack of a better word!). Pictures are the only way to share such nonsense, but they fall far short of a first-hand impression.

The Western States Angus Auxiliary outdoes itself each year with the ringside decorations, and a relaxed atmosphere always seems to assure general high spirits in Reno. Good cattle and good folks just seem to round out a first-class affair. Our congratulations to the Western National Angus Futurity committee for another great event.

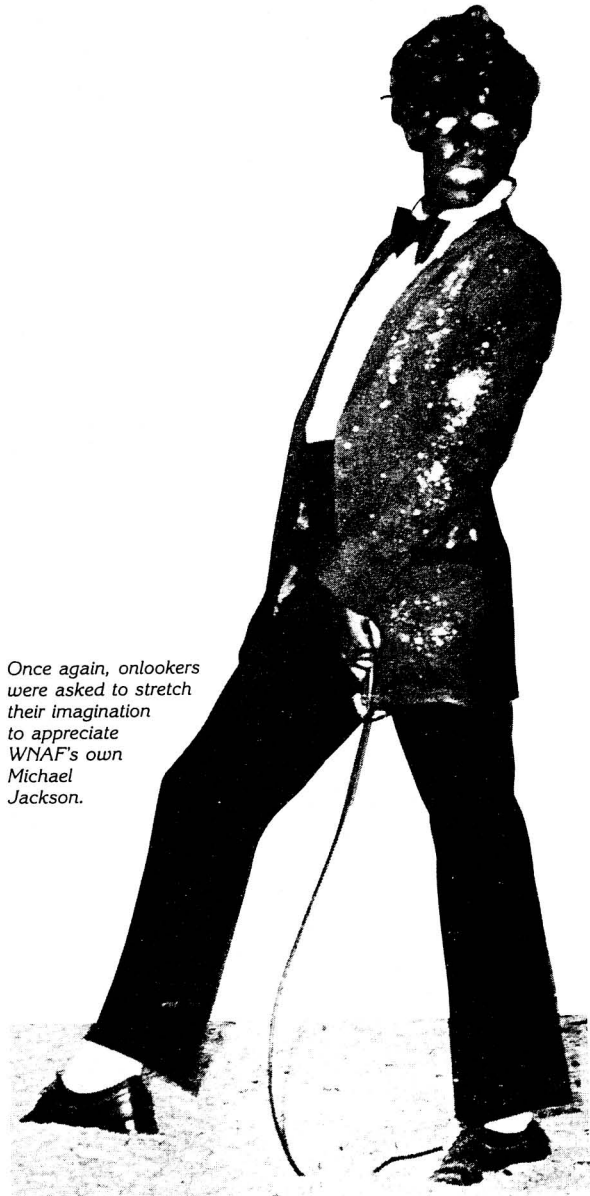

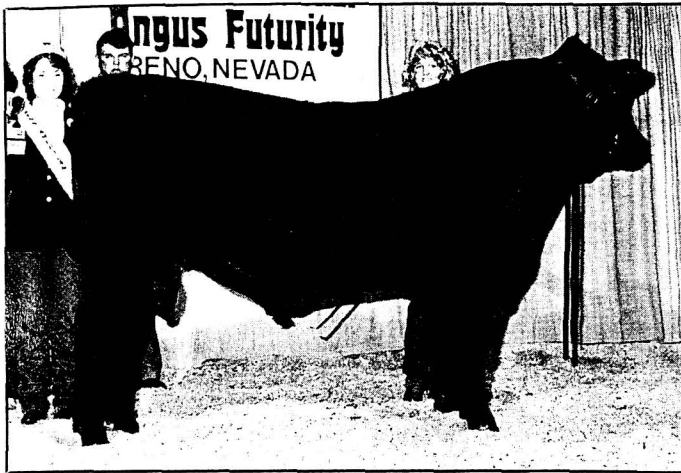

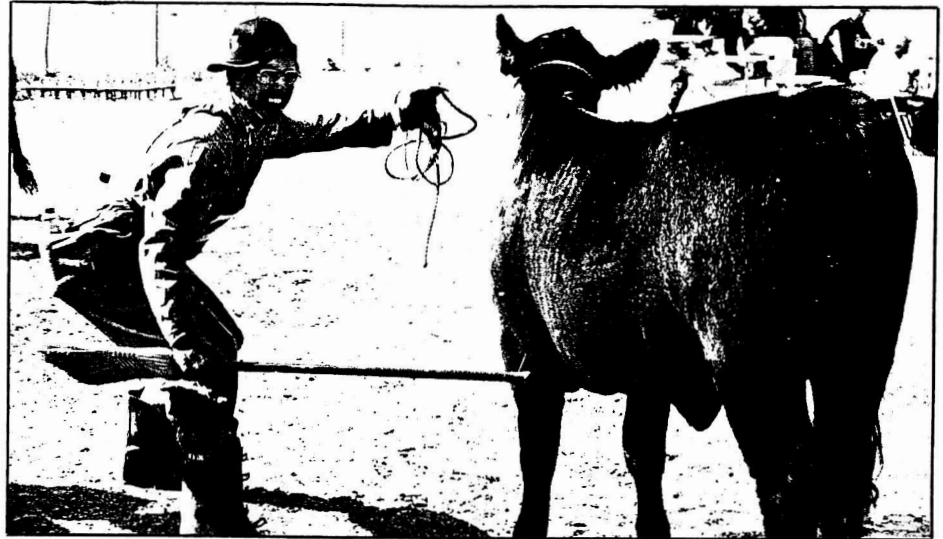

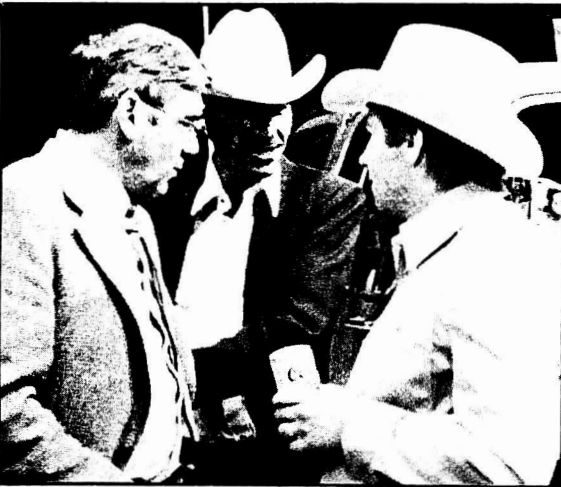
