UBIA Performance Bull Test

Announcement

The Utah Beef Improvement Association (UBIA) has announced the schedule of its upcoming bull test.

The 112-day test will be based on a roughage-based ration and will feature divisions for growth and low-birth-weight Angus bulls, as well as junior and senior divisions. To be eligible, junior bulls must have been born Jan. 1-March 20, 2020. Senior bulls must have been born Sept. 15-Dec. 31, 2019. There is a recommended minimum weight of 650 pounds (lb.).

Bulls will be received at Kenison Farms Feedlot in Levan, Utah, on Oct. 5 to go on test Oct. 20. Interim weights are scheduled to be recorded Nov. 17, Dec. 15, and Jan. 12, 2021. Final weights are scheduled to be recorded Feb. 9, and the test sale will be hosted March 20.

Producers consigned 51 bulls to the 36th Annual Edisto Forage Bull Test. The 168-day test, conducted at the Edisto Research & Education Center near Blackville, S.C., is a 100% forage grazing test and features senior (born Dec. 1, 2018-Jan. 31, 2019) and junior (born Feb. 1-March 31, 2019) divisions.
