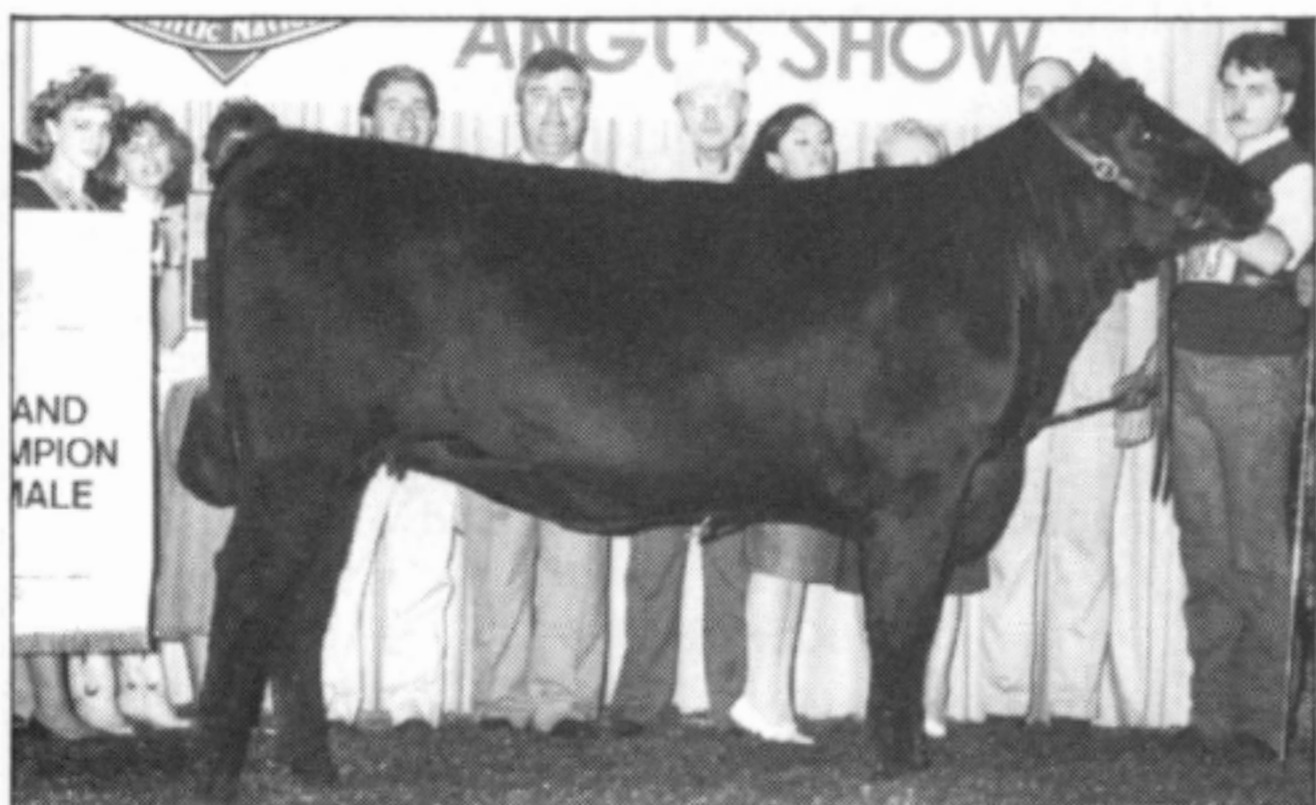
Ribbon cutting ceremonies at the Atlantic National inaugural show were conducted by **Richard L. Spader**, executive vice president of the American Angus Assn., a representative of the State of Maryland dept. of veterinary medicine; **Dr. Joseph Calderazzo**, show chairman; **Mike Jones**, show manager; **Joe Neely**, president of the American Angus Assn.; **Ken Conway**, show judge; **Mrs. James (Dessie) Moxley**, president of the American Angus Auxiliary; and **Mary Wagner**, Miss American Angus.

"Filling a need" may have been uppermost in the minds of those founding the breed's new Atlantic National. Its 1987 debut indicates strong and appreciative support for a national caliber show and event on the eastern seaboard. If it was "an idea whose time has come," the momentum seemed unstoppable for it exceeded the original goals of a 100-head, high quality show that would attract national-level entries.

Mike Jones, show manager, was pleased when the final tally revealed 318 entries, both junior and open categories, representing 16 states.

According to Jones, organization toward an eastern show of national scope first began in June of 1986. A spearheading group of eastern Angus breeders began to muster support and solicit the dollars and pledges toward staging the event. Memorial Day weekend of 1987 bore the fruits.

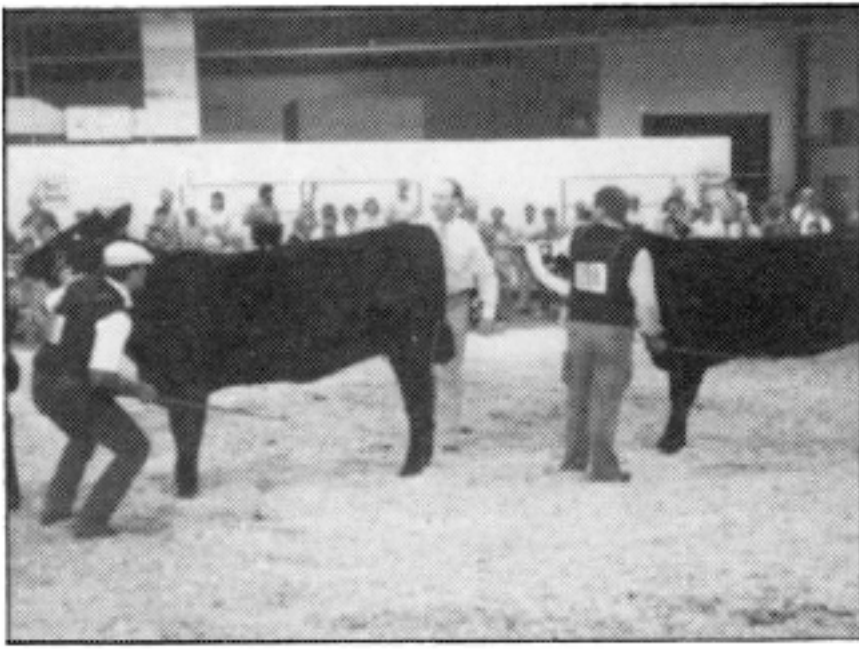
Dr. Joe Calderazzo, York, Pa., chaired a board of trustees formed to steer the idea and mechanics to completion. An executive committee was also formed with the pivotal ingredient in eventual success becoming the Founding Fathers concept developed by the board and executive committee.



Atlantic National intermediate and grand champion female **TC Peggy Sophia 5140**.



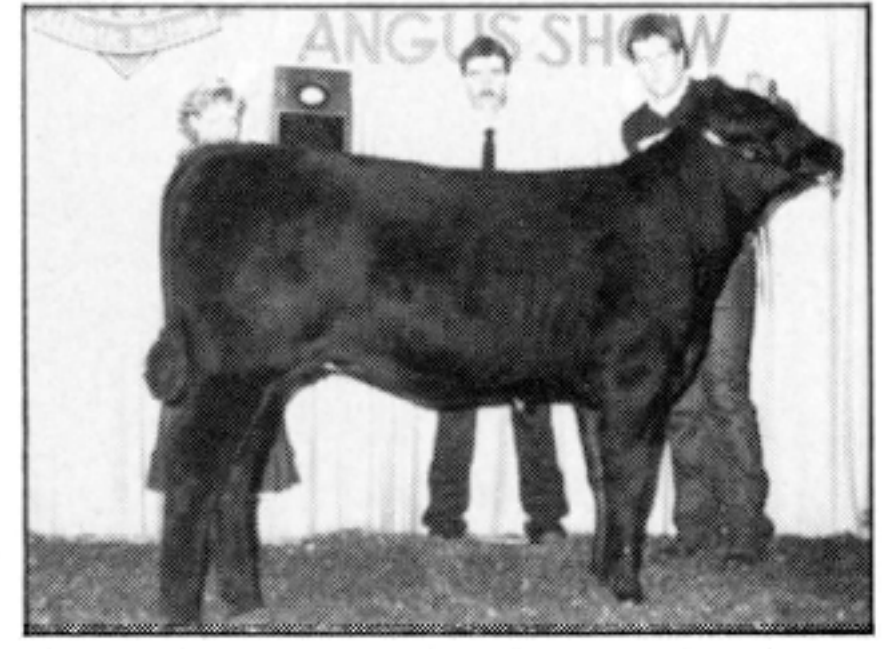

A total 119 firms and individuals contributed funds, some giving a \$1,000 or more, to establish a treasury toward the inauguration show and subsequent events. As a result, the show appears on a solid financial footing. Al Stroobants of Northcote Farm, Forest, Va. was cited for his special effort in fund-raising. Stroobants boosted the show chest by \$57,000 through contacting breeders and even some interested parties who had no cattle but wanted to see the idea thrive. This 1987 show was dedicated to him.

The show is organized under a non-profit structure with a sustaining fund for its future operation. Funds gathered as surplus to the yearly operation of the show are designated for the National Junior Angus Assn. Foundation.

Jones termed feedback from both the participants and the

witnesses to the debut as "excellent. This was designed as a 'people' event, too, where Angus folks could come together for some fun and relaxation."

The weekend's inter-harbor cruise was part of the schedule and planned in that vein. Nearly 200 enjoyed an evening of "sightseeing and fun—no business," said Jones. "We also staged a jam session for the juniors at no cost to them." It was sponsored by the Maryland Angus Assn.

Jones reported excellent cooperation from the staff and management at Maryland's State Fairgrounds for this holiday event. Activities included a Founding Fathers Banquet and embryo auction Sunday evening and concluded with the bull show Monday morning.

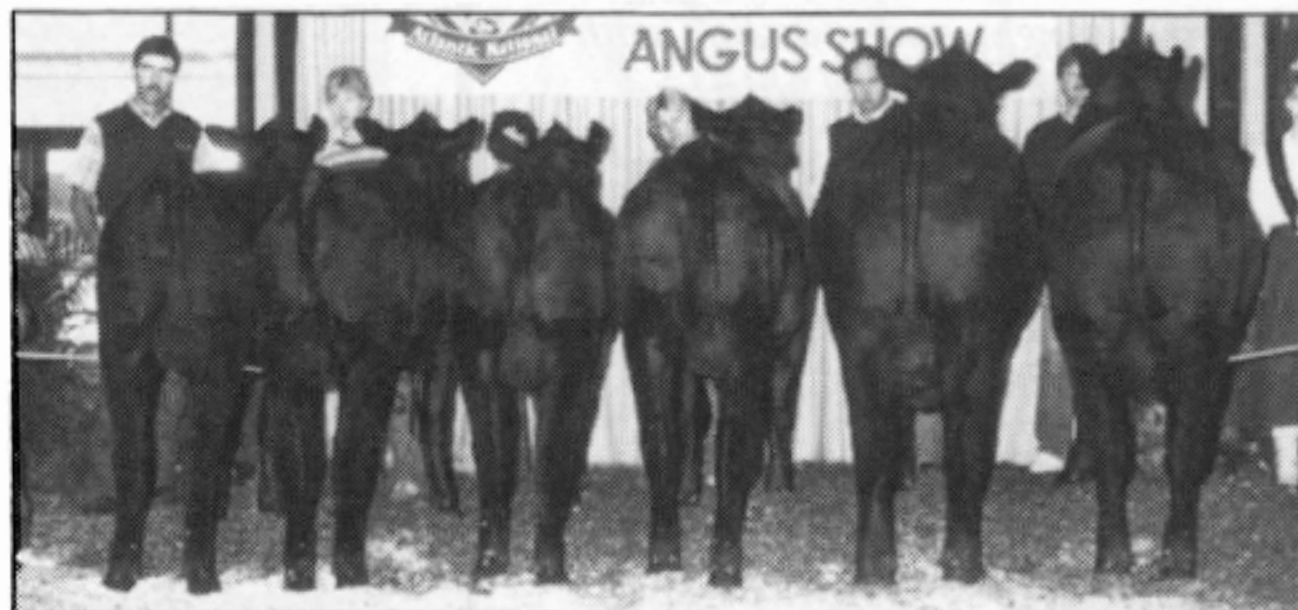

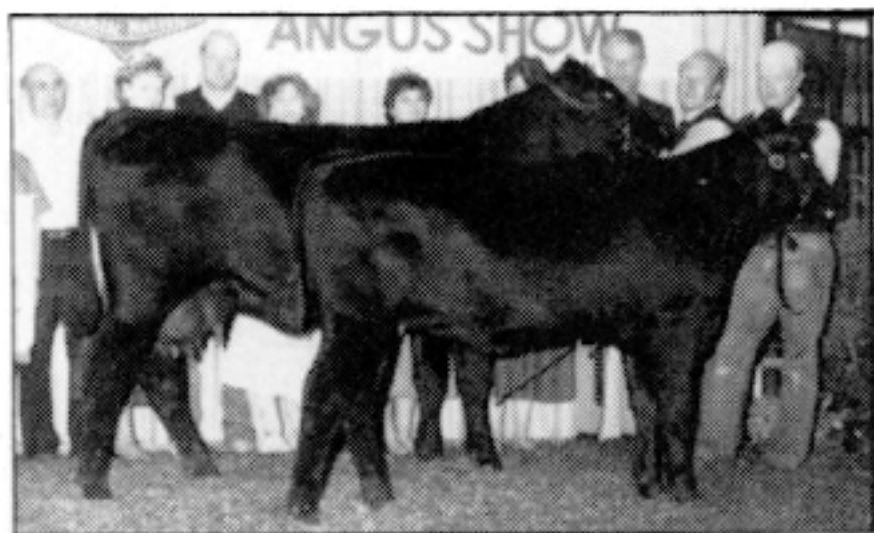

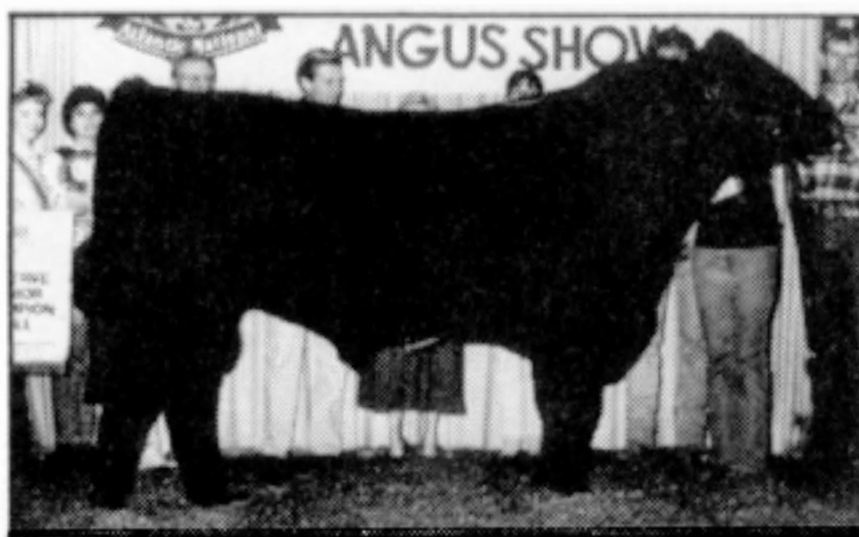

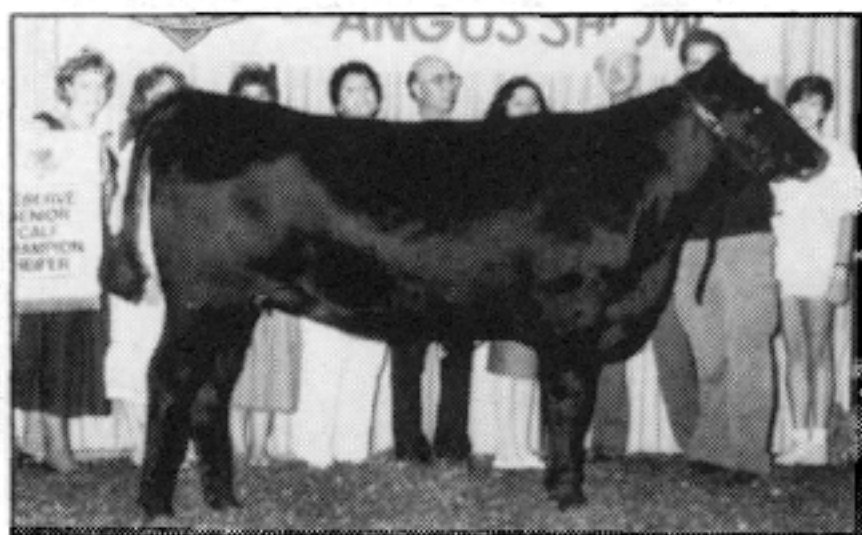

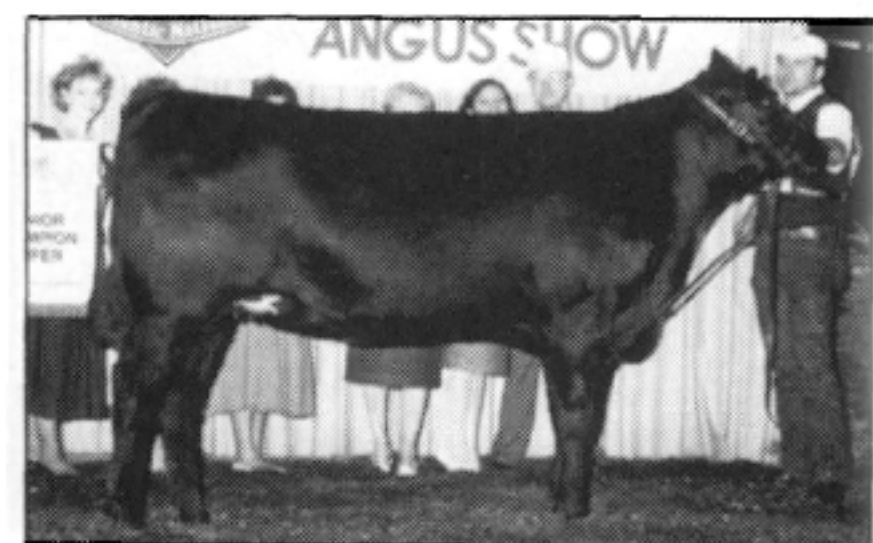
