he Western National Angus Futurity in Angus vernacular that's Renais traditionally both a fun show and an important show. This year was no exception.

The open show's 175 entries (within nine of last year's count) had among them the cream of the crop. Quality generally ran deep, making class and championship placings anything but easy for judge Mark Richardson, Garney Cattle Co., Afton, Okla.

Supreme and grand champion High Voltage, Denver's junior calf champion who created so much interest at that show last January, though without a doubt a popular choice, had to earn his position. Even so, this March 20, 1980, Ken Caryl Mr. Ar gus 8017 son owned by Huckfeldt-Krebs, Gordon, Neb., and Kilgore Angus Ranch, Rising City, Neb., once again had the industry's attention, especially when the news spread that a semen interest had sold the night before the bull show. The buyers were La Biznaga, S.A., and La Paloma, S.A., both with Buenos Aires, Argentina, addresses. The price was undisclosed.

Folks from the west coast were particularly proud of the reserve grand bull, Silveiras Main Event. A native son, the March 1979 Sayre Patriot bull was bred and exhibited by Silveria Bros., Mendota, Calif. And, needless to say, the Silveiras hosted a good-sized crowd at the stall after the show.

Also representing the west coast, this time on the distaff side, Archies Emma claimed her second Reno grand championship. The January 1979 daughter of Patrick McHenry bred by Archie and Emma Hess, Aurora, Ore., and jointly owned by Buck and Barbara Stevens, S/2 Angus at Pt. Reyes, Calif., and Premier Beef Cattle, Fowlerville, Mich., has been in transplant at Premier and is now at S/2.

The popular youngster BTR Petunia Aerrick 18, junior calf champion in Denver, was reserve grand female. The Ken Caryl Mr. Angus 8017 daughter calved last March at Russ and Barb Pepper's ranch at Simms, Mont., was last fall's NILE sale topper and was shown by Bear Creek Angus Ranch, Cameron, Mont., and Huckfeldt-Krebs.

A semen interest in Kilgore's and Huckfeldt-Krebs' High Voltage was sold the night before he carned grand champion bull honors and was named supreme champion of the Western National Angus Futurity. Buyers (in front of the 1,365-lb. 3-20-80 son of Ken Caryl Mr. Angus 8017) were Edwardo Pampillo and Enrique Marmillon of La Biznaga. S.A.. and La Paloma, S.A.. Buenos Aires, Argentina. Behind the bull are co-owners Mr. & Mrs. Glenn Kilgore, Joe Huckfeldt, the Kilgores' sons Patrick and David, and Eldon Krebs.

The open show, though hands-down the main attraction, was not the Western National Angus Futurity's only well-attended event.

There was a strong junior show, with 31 bred-and-owned and 45 owned heifers parading for judge Steve Weaver, Weaver Angus Farm, Peoria, Ill. And the bred-and owned group made their presence felt when, for the first time in the show's history, a female from that division claimed the grand championship. She was Ricks Juanadabury 3000, a March 1980 Sayre Patriot daughter shown by Rick Blanchard, Mendota, Calif. Behind her in reserve grand spot was Stephanie Nelson, Salmon, Idaho, with Nelson Blackbird 0118, a January 1980 daughter of Nelson Hi Power.

A junior fitting contest, a showmanship contest, a queen contest, a round of Angus Bowl capped off the junior activities.

Then there was Ladies Day—a rather unique event—followed by the now traditional Monday night oyster feed, supplemented this year by a well-attended steak fry.

There were also the inevitable tales of

winnings—both large and small—and losses, most of which did not take place in the show ring. The casinos, in fact, kept some folks pretty busy, and some also took time to enjoy one of the several shows in Reno or nearby Tahoe—like Helen Reddy, Mac Davis, Marie and Donnie Osmond.

Western States Angus Assn.'s Dick and Diane Beck (who planned to leave soon for Wye Angus, Queenstown, Md.) and the futurity committee—Chris Abend, Jim Bessler, Bill Cox, Jon Cox, Patsy Foote, Don Jacobs, Henry LaFranchi, Dave Medeiros, Clyde Nelson, Bill Roche, Abbie Schmutz, Darwin Schweitzer, Buck Stevens and Jerry Wagner—saw that things ran smoothly.

One could say a lot more about the Reno show. It's fun. It's relaxed. The barns and tieouts host some of the breed's finest. But let's let pictures tell the story.






