Illinois historic Angus herd

In 1968 Duane and Doris Kruse established DeKap Angus Farm in Lanark, Ill. The American Angus Association recognizes the Kruses' herd with the Historic Angus Herd award to showcase their commitment to the Angus breed. This award is presented to active Angus breeders and immediate family members who have been in continuous production of registered Angus cattle for 50 years or more.

Duane and Doris chose the Angus breed because of its popularity in America. The couple purchased their first cattle from Ken Truman and Richard Zuck and his daughter Susan, all from Lanark. He also purchased cattle from the Pioneer Dispersal Sale in Johnston, Iowa, and Colonel Tommy Williams of Comar, Ill.

The Kruses purchased Bradmar Queen 436 at the Williams' sale. She became the foundation of DeKap Angus Farm, producing prizewinning animals shown at major shows across the country for the past decade.

The main focus of the DeKap operation has always been performance cattle, resulting in top-selling, high-performing cattle at several state bull tests and the Annual Illinois Angus Futurity.

The Kruses continue to live on DeKap Angus Farm, where Angus cattle, Angus friends and family are simply a way of life. They have four children, eight grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

He demonstrates commitment to Alabama BCIA performance principles and has promoted Alabama BCIA in each level of his involvement within the beef cattle industry. Dyar Angus produces performance Angus seedstock with numerous years of participation in BCIA bull evaluations and consignment sales, earning top bull honors and producing high-selling bulls.

Dyar currently serves on the American Angus Association Board of Directors. Dyar served as president of Alabama BCIA in 2007 and as president of the Alabama Beef Cattle Improvement Foundation from 2007 to 2016, where he was a primary originator of the foundation and its efforts. The Spirit of BCIA Award recognizes and honors a member who exemplifies the commitment to BCIA performance principles and who has sought to promote the BCIA program. J.H. Graydon Farm is owned and operated by husband and wife team Rusty and Debbie Graydon. The farm has produced Angus seedstock for the past 30 years, utilizing the Angus Herd Improvement Record (AHIR®) system since the late 1980s to keep track of and analyze all performance records of their vast herd.

Additionally, he started teaching Continued on page 102 YOUR LIFE



Wayne married Evelyn llene Young on Nov. 9, 1952, at the First Baptist Church in Columbia, Mo. He practiced veterinary medicine in Winigan, Mo., from June 1956 to October 1979. He became fieldman for the Missouri Angus Association Oct. 1, 1979, and graduated from Missouri Action School in January 1980. He worked more than 1,500 cattle sales and retired from the Association on Feb. 29, 2004.

As a member of the First Baptist Church in Winigan, he served as Sunday school teacher, Sunday school secretary, training union director in addition to the Sunday school superintendent.

He served as chairman of the Sullivan County Health Department Board, Sullivan County Memorial Hospital Board and the Sullivan County Ambulance Board. He also served four terms as judge of the Sullivan County Court (now called County Commissioner) Organization Chairman, was first president of the Sullivan County Public Water District Organization chairman and first president of the Sullivan County Cattleman's Association. Doc served as president of the Sullivan County Farm Bureau, was chairman of the Sullivan County Extension Council, and served on the state advisory council. He was chairman of the Sullivan County Republican Committee; served on the Agriculture Advisory Committee for Governor Kit Bond, Senator John Danforth and Representative Tom Coleman; and was appointed to the state ASCS Committee (now FSA) by the first George Bush, serving four years, one as chairman.

32 Degree Freemason, serving as District Grand Master, president of the Sullivan County Angus Association, president of the Chariton Valley Angus Association and secretary of the Green Hills Angus Association. He was recognized with a Who's Who in Veterinary Science and Medicine, Who's Who in Community Service, and 1980 Junior Angus Association Man of the Year.

In 1995 he was the first inductee to the Missouri Angus Breeders Hall of Fame; in 1997, inducted into the National Junior Angus Honorary Foundation; and in 1997, the Missouri State Fair Cattle Show was dedicated to him. In 2001 he was inducted into the American Angus Heritage Foundation. In 2004, the University of Missouri Block and Bridle club named him Livestock Person of the Year. The 2004 National Junior Angus Association show was dedicated to him. Also in 2004, he was the second inductee into the Northeast Missouri Livestock Hall of Fame and named Missouri Cattlemen's Association Pioneer Cattleman of the Year.

Doc has spent most of his life in the Loeffler and Winigan areas. He was preceded in death by his father, Frank; his mother, Sylvia; his brother, Donald; his wife, Evelyn on July 27, 2012; as well as his grandparents, aunts and uncles.
