Alabama BCIA

Announcement

The schedule for the 51st annual Alabama Beef Cattle Improvement Ass'n (BCIA) bull test has been announced. Nominations for the test were due June 6.

The 84-day test is conducted at the North Alabama Bull Evaluation Center near Cullman, Ala., and will feature bulls born Aug. 1-Oct. 31, 2022. Bulls will be fed a full-gain ration.

The bulls will be received July 11. On-test weights will be recorded Aug. 8, and final weights are scheduled to be collected Oct. 31. Qualifying bulls will sell in the test sale Dec. 9, hosted at the Cullman Stockyards.

Calhoun HERD Program Report 4 (April 3)

The University of Georgia (UGA) has concluded its Heifer Evaluation and Reproductive Development (HERD) Program at Calhoun, Ga., for heifers born Dec. 2021 to Feb. 2022. The heifers were evaluated on performance, reproductive traits and disposition, and fed a ration to gain 1.5-1.75 pounds (lb.) per day. The heifers represent 16 consignors, and were synchronized and bred by artificial insemination (Al) Feb. 27, then exposed to a clean-up bull. The main Al sire was GAR Sure Fire, but heifers closely related were bred to Baldridge Marksman D274.

When weights were recorded March 28, the 99 heifers' average weight was 887 lb., and their average WDA was 1.94 lb.

The Calhoun HERD sale was to be hosted May 31.

Connors State College Bull Test Announcements

Florida Bull Test Announcement

The 2023-2024 Florida Bull Test will be hosted at the North Florida Research and Education Center at Marianna, Fla., for bulls born Aug. 15-Dec. 31, 2022.

The ration is formulated with a target gain of 3.5 lb. per day. During the first 56 days of the test, bulls will be fed a total mixed ration with grain byproducts and forage. For the remainder of the test, bulls will receive the same diet in self-feeders,

with a slightly reduced amount of roughage and *ad libitum* access to hay.

Delivery of the bulls is scheduled to be July 25, and initial weights will be recorded Aug. 15-16. Interim weights will be recorded Sept. 13, Oct. 10-11 and Nov. 8. Final weights will be collected Dec. 5-6. The test sale is scheduled to be hosted Jan. 20, 2024. To qualify, bulls must achieve an index ratio of 90, calculated as WDA+ADG.
