North Carolina Tests

The North Carolina Beef Cattle Improvement Program (NC BCIP) has announced the dates for its 2018 Butner and Waynesville bull tests. The primary purpose of the NC BCIP is to serve as an educational aid for the genetic improvement and promotion of beef cattle. The purpose of the tests is to standardize environmental conditions and feed for evaluation postweaning performance and to provide useful records for the consignor to use in evaluating and planning his or her breeding program.

The Waynesville evaluation is for bulls born Aug. 1-Nov. 15, 2017. Bulls were delivered to North Carolina Department of Agriculture Mountain Research Station at Waynesville, N.C., June 27, 2018, to go on test July 9-10. Interim weights are scheduled for Sept. 4 and Oct. 2, with final weights to be collected Oct. 29-30. Qualified bulls will sell at the WNC Regional Livestock Center in Canton, N.C., Dec. 7.

The Butner evaluation is for bulls born Aug. 15-Nov. 15, 2017. Bulls were to be delivered to the Butner Beef Cattle Field Laboratory at Bahama, N.C., July 11, 2018, to go on test July 23-24. Interim weights are scheduled for Sept. 18 and Oct. 16, with final weights to be collected Nov. 12-13.

Qualified bulls will sell at the Granville County Livestock Arena in Oxford, N.C., Dec. 21.

Connors State Bull Tests

Connors State College (CSC) announced the dates for its fall 2018 and spring 2019 bull tests.

Bulls born Sept. 1-Nov. 30, 2017, were to be delivered to the station located on the Connors State College campus at Warner, Okla., July 12-14, 2018, to begin the fall test July 19. Interim weights are scheduled for Sept. 13 and Oct. 11. Bulls will be weighed off the 112-day test Nov. 8. Those qualifying for the sale will be auctioned Nov. 29 at the Springville Feeder Auction.

Nominations are due Oct. 5 for the Spring 2019 CSC Bull Test. The test is for bulls born Jan. 1-March 30. The station will accept delivery Nov. 29-30 and the bulls will go on test

Dec. 6. Interim weights are scheduled for Jan. 31 and Feb. 28, 2019. Bulls will be weighed off the 112-day test March 28. Qualifying bulls will sell on site April 11.

The bulls will be fed a complete grow-finish ration free-choice designed to allow for maximum growth, but not intended to overfinish fast-gaining bulls. Coarse grass hay will also be available throughout the tests.

The purposes of the tests are fourfold:

- to evaluate bulls for postweaning performance;
- to educate seedstock producers and commercial cattlemen about the value and utilization of performance records and expected progeny differences;
- to provide a source of and market for performance-tested bulls; and
- to provide an opportunity for new breeders to introduce their breeding programs to potential new customers.
