The 2020 Clemson Bull Test will take delivery of bulls on Aug. 6. The test will feature two divisions: seniors (born Sept. 1-Oct. 31, 2018) and juniors (Nov. 1-Dec. 31, 2018).

The bulls will begin the 112-day test Aug. 20, following a 14-day warm-up period. Interim weights for the 112-day test will be collected Sept. 17, Oct. 15 and Nov. 12. Final weights will be taken Dec. 10. Qualifying bulls will sell Feb. 1, 2020.

A change this year, bulls will no longer be ratioed for ADG, WDA and yearling weight within breed. Rather, they will be ratioed by age and breed makeup category. British breeds will be ratioed against each other with a senior and junior category. Continental breeds will be ratioed together in the same way. American breeds/ear breeds will be ratioed against each other.
