### In passing



Walter Cecil 'Cec' McCurry, 86, Mt. Hope, Kan., passed away June 5, 2019.

McCurry was the youngest of

seven children of Cora Lee Workman McCurry and Walter McCurry. He was born Nov. 12, 1932, in Geneseo, Kan. He graduated from Mount Hope High School in 1950 and entered the United States Army in 1955. Eventually, McCurry was stationed in Anchorage, Alaska. After he was discharged from the Army, he returned to the family farm near Bentley, Kan.

In 1958, he and his four brothers entered into a partnership known as McCurry Brothers Angus. In 1962, they purchased the old Bridgman Elevator which McCurry managed until it was sold in 2005. He continued to be active in the cattle business, serving on the American Angus Association Board of Directors and as president of the Kansas Angus Association. McCurry was a farmer, stockman and a man of agriculture. He often quoted the 4-H motto "To make the best better," and he lived it.

McCurry and his wife, Sandra, were named honorary members of the Kansas Angus Association in 2014 and received the National Angus Heritage Foundation award in 2011.

Survivors include his wife of 65 years, Sandra Hill McCurry; three sons, Brad (Alicia) McCurry, Greg (Pam) McCurry, and Geoff (Lucy) McCurry; 10 grandchildren; 18 great grandchildren; and Odell McCurry, his brother.

#### In recognition CAA announces board executive

The Canadian Angus Association (CAA) announces the 2019–2020 board executives selected during the Canadian Angus National Convention in Drumheller, AB.

Bob Hahn of Sherwood Park, AB, was elevated from the position of president elect to president. Trevor Welch of Glassville, NB, moved into the past president position, and Shawn Birmingham of Brandon, MB, was chosen as president elect.

Hahn was elected to the CAA board in 2013 and was elected for a second term in 2016. He has operated HR Hahn Cattle Co. in Sherwood Park, AB, since 2000. Hahn served on the Alberta Angus Association board of directors from 2008 through 2012. He is also a chartered accountant and

operates his own practice, Hahn & Houle Chartered Accountants.

Welch is the fourth generation of his family to farm on their land: Garvie Mountain Angus. He, his father Fred Welch and son Taylor Welch currently run around 30 mother cows, made up of purebred black Angus and black baldie commercial cows. Welch is a professional engineer and a licensed New Brunswick Land Surveyor by profession, and is the owner of Welch Surveys Ltd.

Birmingham and his wife Teresa operate TSN Angus Livestock. They calve approximately 250 females each year, 80 of which are purebred black Angus. Shawn and Teresa's passion for the breed has been recognized on several occasions, including receiving the 2012 Manitoba Angus Purebred Breeder of the Year award as well as the 2016 Outstanding Young Angus Breeder award from the CAA.
