To make the perfect match, reserve junior champion Summitcrest Miss Angus R003 was selected for reserve grand champion owned heifer title. Victoria Johnson, Summitville, Ohio, exhibited the PS Power Play daughter and met hearty home-state approval.

Carrying an impact from Idaho, Janna Nelson-Herbst, Salmon, brought Nelson Golden Girl to the winning tan-bark, stopping first with the KAF Gold Strike daughter at junior champion before accepting her bred-and-owned grand champion cup.

Kimberly Sydenstricker's February Pine Drive Big Sky daughter, SAF Wendy Lady 3043, caught the attention to earn the reserve bred-and-owned position.

Bull numbers were down from last year to 28, but quality ran consistently in the classes. Susan Patton, Crawfordsville, Ind., showed JFP Amazement to grand champion royalty. The Kruegers Foolish Pride son was earlier named intermediate champion. James O'Neill led O'Neills Excalibur to receive the lavender rosette. Making a strong stand in the junior champion division, the Gunston Tall Texan son completed the top pair of bull winners.

California boasted its own pep club section and cheering the cow-calf champion was one of the group's assignments. Rick Blanchard, Mendota,

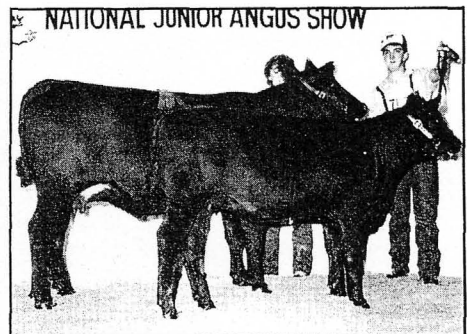

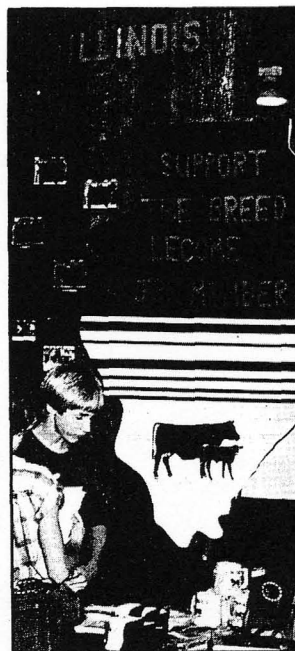

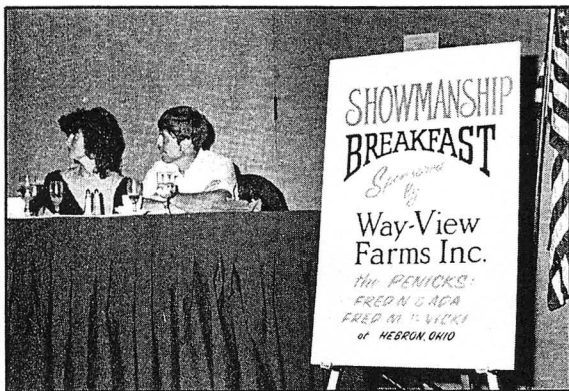

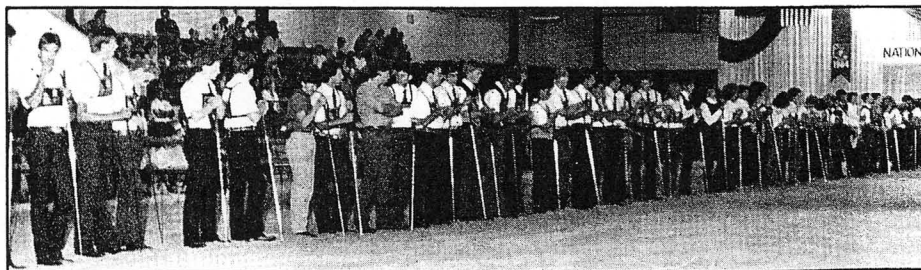

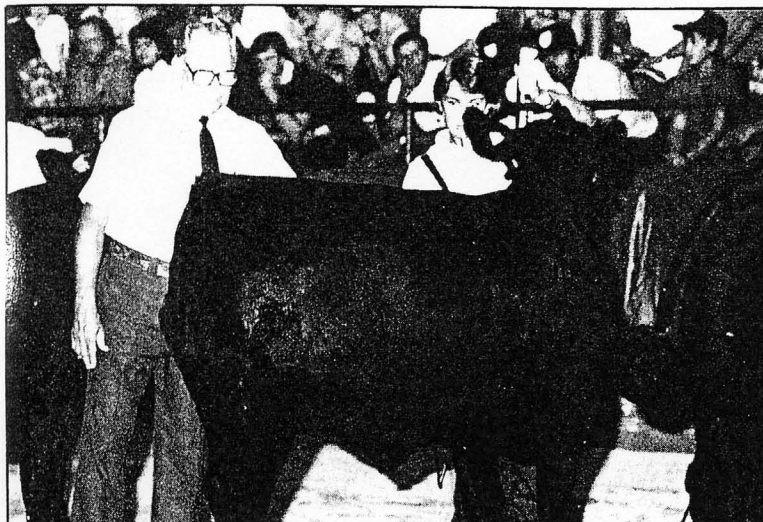

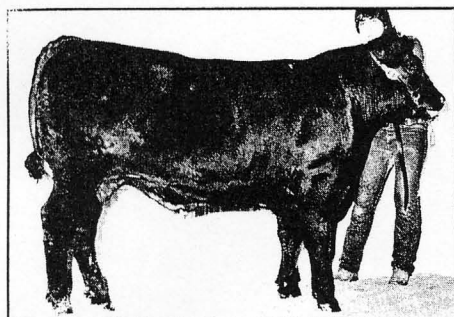


## Angus Steer Classic

The first-ever Angus Steer Classic, sponsored by the American Angus Assn., was held in conjunction with the National Junior Angus Show. Thirty-three head were evaluated on hoof before being graded in the cooler.

Steers had to weigh a minimum of 900 lb. on hoof. This was a terminal show and final placings were determined by using an index based 50 percent on carcass data and 50 percent on on-hoof placing and weight per day of age (WDA). Cindy Houck, Bushong, Kan., exhibited her steer who was third in class and later, combined with carcass evaluation, named grand champion. Reserve grand champion steer stood second in class and was shown by Daniel Rapp, Gibsonburg, Ohio.
