


hat better fellowship than at a show? The National Junior Angus Show is a much-looked-forito event by Juniors and their families each year. And 1985 was no exception.


Even the Oklahoma heat could not put a damper on the enthusiasm that prevailed during this week in Tulsa. A short, four days provided a full schedule of contests, meetings and elections, Angus Olympics, a beef cook-off, tours and an ever-exciting 497-head show.

Mary Ellen Shaw, West Bend, Wis., was elected chairman of the NJAA board for the coming year, the registered Angus steer show continued in its second year of growth with 47 head shown and Tim Fitzgerald of Harrison, Neb., won the National Junior Showmanship Contest.

HF Duchess 451 was crowned champion owned heifer for her proud owner Susan Moxley, West Friendship, Md. Duchess is a May yearling by QLC Winchester and had walked away with the Eastern Regional Junior Heifer Show title just two weeks prior to Tulsa. She started her career in Denver this year and won the spring heifer calf division championship.






Another regional junior show winner was right behind Duchess all the way and that was E&W Dolly, the reserve intermediate and reserve champion female. Dolly is a June 1984 Greenbrae Chairman daughter and is owned by Stacia Ellis, Greentown, Ind. Dolly won the Western National Angus Futurity Junior Regional Show in April.

Ryan Cotton, Howell, Mich., led his bred-and-owned entry Premier Venus, to that division's highest honor. This January 1984 Premier Independence KN daughter was first named junior champion.

The Brisbin's from Colorado did quite well with their bred-and-owned entries including showing the reserve champion bred-and-owned heifer. 4B Big Sky Sophia, a Pine Drive Big Sky daughter earned her title for owner Jody Brisbin of Longmont, Colo.

The bred-and-owned bull show boasted of 32 entries—up from last year's 28—and were paraded in front of judge Joe Bill Meng of Bowling Green, Ky. Amy Ostrum of Loganville, Ga., showed Prince of Shiloh to champion honors and Clifford Simmons II, Williamston, Mich., led Omegan Domino to the reserve position.










The top five finalists alone represented the states of Nebraska, California, Oregon, Louisiana and Pennsylvania.







Sheri Rentz, Coldwater, Ohio. emerged as the overall winner. Her steer. Creek Side Biltmore, stood first in class and fifth in the carcass contest. He is a June 1984 Pine Drive Big Sky son and weighed 1,100 lb.; had a WDA of 2.72 lb.; a hot carcass weight of 666 lb.; graded low choice; and had a 2.4 vield grade.

The final placings in the carcass division were determined by using a 50 percent carcass placing index and a 50 percent on-hoof placing index. Dr. Fred Ray and his staff at Oklahoma State University, Stillwater, judged the carcasses.
