# Juriar Argus nenbers elect rational officers and directors

unior Angus members from across the nation gathered in Des Moines, Iowa, July 10-15 to attend the annual meeting of the National Junior Angus Association (NJAA). The meeting was conducted in conjunction with the 2000 National Junior Angus Show (NJAS) at the Iowa State Fairgrounds.

Delegates elected six new directors to the NJAA Board of Directors, and new officers were announced at the awards ceremony on July 14. The directors elected to officer positions are beginning the second year of their two-year terms.

**Sonya Smith,** Lebanon, Tenn., will serve as chairman of the NJAA. **Brandon Douglas,** Gentry, Ark., will be the vice chairman.

**Allison Porter**, Jefferson, Ga., will be communications director, and **Sy Olson**, Hereford, Texas, will be the Angus Foundation director.

Leadership director will be **Miranda Grissom**, Prague, Okla. **Jamie Meyer**, Douglass, Kan., is the new membership information director.

Candidates from 14 states vied for the six open positions on the board. Delegates from 32 states cast ballots for their top six

picks after candidates submitted applications, gave oral presentations and completed roundtable interviews. A brief biography of the six newly elected directors follows.

**Brittney Burns**, Kickapoo, Ill., is the daughter of Richard and Colleen Burns. She will be a sophomore at the University of Illinois and is studying child psychology. She has been active in the Illinois Junior Angus Association, and this year she placed fourth in the National Junior Angus Showmanship Contest. On campus, she is a member of the University of Illinois Student Alumni Association and Kappa Alpha Theta social sorority. She is also active in the Hoof 'N Horn Club.

Heath Johnson, Tupelo, Miss., will transfer to Mississippi State University this fall where he will major in premedicine, microbiology. He has been active in the Mississippi Junior Angus Association, where he has held several leadership positions. He is on the executive committee for the 2001 Eastern Regional Junior Angus Show. In addition, he is active in his church and has served as vice president of the state 4-H council. He is the son of Stuart and Alyce Johnson.

**Tom Patterson,** Columbus, Mont., is a sophomore at Colby Community College, Colby, Kan. He is majoring in animal science and is a member of the livestock-judging team. The son of John and Pam Patterson, he has been active in the Montana Junior Angus Association for many years. He has attended several LEAD (Leaders Engaged in Angus Development) conferences and participated in numerous contests at the NJAS.

Hailing from Bassett, Neb., **Jessica Sawyer** is a sophomore at Kansas State
University and hopes to pursue a career in
medicine. She has been active on her state
4-H Action Team, and she has held
leadership roles in the Nebraska Junior
Angus Association. In addition to winning

Award in 1999 [for which she was profiled

Ryan Sweeney, Mason, Mich., is the son of Pete and Barbara Sweeney. He will be a sophomore at Michigan State University with a dual major in animal science and agribusiness management. He served as the Michigan FFA president and will serve as vice president of the Block & Bridle Club on campus. A top-five finalist in this year's National Junior Angus Showmanship Contest, he is a member of the Michigan State Fair Junior Board.
