

The American Angus Association has recognized **Miller Bar 3W Angus Farm,** King City, Mo., as a Historic Angus Herd based on the farm's continuous production of Angus cattle for the past 50 years.

The operation started as Walter Miller and Sons in 1951 and continued under that name until 1971, when Walter and one of his sons began crossbreeding a commercial herd. William B. Miller, another son of Walter, took 25 of the registered Angus cows from the original herd and continued breeding registered Angus under the Miller Bar 3W Angus Farm name.

Over the years, additional foundation cows were purchased from area Angus breeders and consignment sales. The herd grew to 50 head, and William kept his best heifers every year and bred them to outstanding bulls. Some of the bulls were purchased from breeders in Massachusetts and Indiana. William reduced his herd to 25 cows in 2000.

A certificate recognizing the achievement has been sent to William B. Miller to honor his farm for its longevity in breeding registered Angus cattle.
