FCF Phyllis 770 was named supreme champion and grand champion female. Tucker Bayer, Ringle, Wis., owns the October 2017 daughter of Silveira's Style 9303. She first won senior champion.

Reese Anderson, Chrisman, Ill., led the reserve grand champion female after winning late junior champion. DDA Barbara 1819 is a March 2018 daughter of S&R Roundtable J328.

WCC Chips F6 earned grand champion bull honors. Anne Patton Schubert, Taylorsville, Ky.; Wilson Cattle Company, Cloverdale, Ind.; and Wooden Shoe Farms, Blackfoot, Idaho, own the March 2018 son of EXAR Blue Chip 1877B. He first won junior champion.
