

National Junior Angus Show Results

Nearly 530 Angus juniors and their families traveled to Tulsa, Okla., to compete in the 2020 National Junior Angus Show July 22-24 at the Expo Square Pavilion.

National Junior Angus Association (NJAA) members gathered with the mindset “It’s All OK” as they exhibited 861 entries during the weeklong National Junior Angus Show (NJAS) that included more than a dozen educational contests in addition to the cattle show.



B&O FEMALES

Junior Angus exhibitors led 191 heifers in the bred-and-owned (B&O) show at the NJAS July 22. Brian McCulloh, Viroqua, Wis., assisted by Joe Myers, Harrodsburg, Ky., evaluated the entries before selecting top five champions.

Olivia Gerloff, Bland, Mo., captured grand champion B&O female honors with Gerloff Pride Ever 901. The January 2019 heifer was sired by PVF Surveillance 4129. Winning the early junior champion division took this female to the top of the final drive.

BRDG Princess 930 claimed the reserve grand champion B&O female title. She was shown by Bowen Bridges, Oklahoma City, Okla. This October 2019 daughter of EXAR Blue Chip 1877B was first named early calf champion.

Claiming third overall B&O female was Cutter Pohlman, Hereford, Texas, with Pohlman Ariel 8439. The September 2018 female was sired by Colburn Primo 5153 and first claimed senior champion.

Ellee Marksbury, Buffalo, Ky., led the fourth overall champion B&O

female, Voyager Georgina 869. She is the November 2019 daughter of Colburn Primo 5153 and earlier won late calf champion.

Breeze Hill Georgina 9126 was named fifth overall B&O female. Keegan Mather, State Center, Iowa, led the February 2019 daughter of Silveira’s Style 9303. She first won reserve early junior champion.
