The 36 steers were evaluated by Dave Duello, Clarkesville, Ga. Competitors also entered 39 carcass steers at the event.

Julie Dameron, Lexington, III., claimed top honors in the bred-and-owned female show, exhibiting the grand champion and reserve grand champion females. The grand champion female was Dameron Bardot 8144. The April '98

The reserve grand champion bred-and-owned female was Dameron Georgina 849. The Feb. '98 daughter of TC Stockman 365 previously won early junior champion female.

Jason Michael, Mount Solon, Va., led Dameron PVF Proven Queen 822 to the winner's circle as she was named grand champion owned female. The April '98 daughter of Rito 9FB3 of 5H11 Fullback first won junior champion division 1.


