# Make Plans for LOUISVILLE

embers of the American Angus Association will gather at the 2000 North American International Livestock Exposition (NAILE) Nov. 12-14 in Louisville, Ky. Angus breeders from 44 states and Canada are expected to attend the Association's Annual Meeting and the Super Point Roll of Victory (ROV) Angus Show.

The junior Angus heifer show will kick off the three-day event at 8 a.m., Sunday, Nov. 12, in the Kentucky Fair and Exposition Center (KFEC) Coliseum. Later that day, members will hear updates from the Association's Commercial Relations Department and the Certified Angus Beef LLC (CAB) Supply Development Team at 1 p.m. Both meetings will be in the South Wing Conference Center.

At 2 p.m., candidates will make brief presentations on why they are qualified to serve as a director, then they will answer questions from the floor. Association programs and goals, beef industry issues, and other important topics of concern are usually addressed, putting the candidates'

knowledge and leadership skills to the test.

At press time five Angus breeders had announced their candidacies for the Board. Keith Arntzen, Hilger, Mont.; Minnie Lou Bradley, Memphis, Texas; and Abbie Nelson, Wilton, Calif., are seeking re-election. Paul Hill, Bidwell, Ohio; and David Smith, Greensburg, Ind., are also running for a term on the Board. For short biographies of all five candidates, see page 103.

The day's activities will conclude with the Angus reception from 6 to 8 p.m. at the Executive West Hotel.

The female portion of the show will begin at 8 a.m., Monday, Nov. 13, in the coliseum. Dick Hubman, Central Point, Ore., will evaluate the Angus entries. The 2001 Miss American Angus will be crowned before the selection of the grand champion female.

The Annual Meeting will begin at 2 p.m. in the South Wing Conference Center. A total of 341 elected delegates will conduct the business of the Association, as well as elect a president, vice president, treasurer and five Board members.

Charles "Bud" Smith Jr., current Association president from Russell Springs, Ky., will preside over the Annual Meeting, which is open to the public.

Richard Spader, executive vice president, will present his annual report; and Leroy Baldwin, Association treasurer from Ocala, Fla., will give a financial report.

Copies of the Association's 2000 Annual Report will be distributed.

The day will conclude with a social hour at 6 p.m., followed by the Association's Annual Banquet at 7 p.m. at the Executive West Hotel. Mark Mayfield, who is known as "The Corporate Comedian," will headline this year's banquet. A *Certified Angus Beef*  $^{\text{TM}}$  (CAB®) meal will be served.

At the banquet the Association will honor inductees to the Angus Heritage Foundation and recognize the top Roll of Victory (ROV) winners for 2000.

The winner of the 2000 Land Stewardship Award (see page 35), sponsored by the *Angus Journal*, will be honored during the banquet.

The show will conclude Tuesday, Nov. 14, with the bull show in the coliseum.
