2022 Animal Ag Alliance Stakeholders Summit

USDA to Launch Loan Guarantee Initiative

As part of the administration's efforts to address food systems challenges arising from the pandemic, USDA Secretary Tom Vilsack Oct. 4 announced USDA plans for another \$100 million in funding from the *American Rescue Plan Act*. The funding would leverage hundreds of millions more dollars in lending through community and private sector lenders to expand meat and poultry processing capacity and finance other food supply chain infrastructure.

These investments will help deliver more opportunities and fairer prices for farmers and address bottlenecks in the food supply chain revealed and exacerbated by the pandemic.

The Department plans to publish specific details and how to apply as part of USDA's Build Back Better Initiative, a comprehensive plan to invest \$4 billion to strengthen the resiliency of America's food supply chain while promoting competition.
