The Long Haul

Longevity is valued in more than just a cow herd. It's invaluable in the supporters of the Angus Foundation who make their mission of education, youth and research possible year after year.

The Angus Foundation Heifer Package is one of the most unique avenues the Angus Foundation uses to raise funds to support its mission. It wouldn't be a success story without long-standing donors and buyers.

That support comes in the form of the add-on items from donors who have partnered with the Angus Foundation for a large part of its 40year history. This includes Trans Ova Genetics, Sioux Center, Iowa; Lathrop Livestock

Transportation, Dundee, Ill.; and American Live Stock

Insurance Company, Batavia, Ill.

Lathrop Livestock Transportation has provided transportation for the winning bidder for the last 33 years. Sometimes that means taking the animal directly from the sale, and other years they pick her up from the breeder. This year will be the latter.

"The guys who started the program asked us if we would help out with the package when they were creating

it," says Randy Lathrop, owner and operator of



Lathrop Livestock Transportation. "It sounded like a good idea to me to raise funds with the Foundation for



the juniors. It made me proud that they included us on this."

This is just Lathrop's "small" way of giving back to the Business Breed.

"It's pretty simple — this is a good cause and it helps the youth," says Stuart Wilson of American Live Stock Insurance Company. "I am a big believer in the mission of the

> Foundation and I believe it is our duty to give back to the industry and ultimately

support its future."

As a 27-year supporter of the package, American Live Stock Insurance provides 30 days of mortality coverage for the heifer. Plenty has changed in a matter of three decades, but insurance certainly has not.

"This package is a strong propeller of the Angus breed and so is the Foundation," Stuart adds.

the last 27 years, Trans Ova Genetics has evolved their support in tandem with reproductive technologies.

"In the early days, the package would've included conventional embryo transfer (ET) technology," says Mark Allan, director of genetic technology for Trans Ova. "At the time, ET was the leading technology. In-vitro fertilization (IVF) started at Trans Ova and is now part of the Foundation Heifer Package. IVF is now part of a mainstream technology."



Trans Ova now provides genetic preservation along with IVF services for the winning bidder. Support for the package has remained unwavering from both its donors and bidders.

"Developing technologies and supporting the youth will accelerate the success and guarantee the future of any organization," Allan says. "Those two things have to align and be available for the long-term good of the industry and the breed. That's exactly what the Foundation is doing by providing this package every year." AJ
