She enjoyed interacting with the Nichols crew, customers and visitors. She was a great cook, active in many community service projects and known as the "hostess with the mostest."

Survivors include her husband of more than 50 years, Dave Nichols; children, Fletcher and Jennifer; brother, Lans; sisters-in-law, Edy and Lillian; several nieces and nephews; and two grandchildren.
