OPSU Beef Cattle Performance Testing Program

Announcement

Oklahoma Panhandle State University (OPSU) is now conducting its 70th annual Bull Performance Test. The test, conducted at OPSU near Goodwell, Okla., features a junior and a senior division. Bulls are fed a targeted-gain, roughage growing ration with 13% crude protein (CP). Hay is provided ad lib.

Seventy-one bulls representing 17 producers were weighed on test Oct. 9 for the 112-day evaluation. Final weights will be recorded Jan. 29, 2022, and the test sale will be hosted Feb. 21.

Bulls born Aug. 15-Nov. 15, 2020, were weighed on test for the North Carolina Beef Cattle Improvement Program (NC BCIP) Butner Bull Test July 21. The 112-day evaluation is conducted at the Butner Beef Cattle Field Laboratory near Bahama, N.C. The bulls are fed a silage-based diet.

On-test report (Oct. 26)

The University of Georgia Extension is now conducting its 64th Tifton Bull Evaluation. Bulls in the 84-day test were born between Dec. 1, 2020, and Feb. 28, 2021.

Fifty-nine Angus from 16 consignors were among the 109 bulls

weighed on test Oct. 25-26. The Angus bulls averaged 872 lb., with an average frame score of 5.1. The average weight for all bulls was 864 lb., with an average frame score of 5.

Interim weights will be recorded Nov. 23 and Dec. 21, with the final weights observed Jan. 18-19, 2022.

There will be a Tifton Beef Cattle Short Course March 1, and the test sale will be hosted March 2.

MCA/MSU Bull Evaluation Program

Initial report (Oct. 22)

The Michigan Cattlemen's Ass'n (MCA) and Michigan State University (MSU) have weighed bulls on test for their 34th annual bull evaluation, conducted at the Plank Farm, Crystal, Mich.

Bulls will be divided into four pens of no more than 28 per pen, based on age and weight. The oldest pen will constitute the senior division, with the remaining pens composing the junior division. Bulls within each classification will be fed an identical diet formulation. The bulls will be fed a high-fiber, moderate-energy ration designed to allow for an average daily gain (ADG) of 3.4 lb.

The bulls were born Sept. 1, 2020-March 31, 2021, and received at the test station Oct. 8-9.

Fifty-seven Angus bulls are among the 100 bulls being evaluated. Fifteen of the Angus bulls are in the senior division, and 42 comprise the junior Angus division. Overall, the bulls averaged 861 lb. going on test, with the junior bulls averaging 794 lb. and the senior division averaging 1,077 lb.

Additional weights are scheduled to be observed Nov. 19, Dec. 17 and Jan. 14, with final weights scheduled Feb. 10-11. An open house will be hosted March 5, and the test sale will be March 19.

Tifton HERD Program

Initial report (Oct. 25)

The test station received 169 heifers Oct. 4 for the University of Georgia's 23rd annual Heifer Evaluation and Reproductive Development (HERD) Program at Tifton.

The heifers were born Sept. 1-Nov. 30, 2020. During the HERD program, the heifers are evaluated on performance, reproductive traits and disposition. The ration consists of hay plus a supplement designed for growth and development. The heifers are fed to gain 1.5-1.75 lb. per day.

The heifers weighed an average of 706 lb. at delivery Oct. 4, and 762 lb. Oct. 25 for an average weight per day of age (WDA) of 2.03 lb. Their average frame score was 4.6.

During the evaluation, the heifers will be synchronized and artificially inseminated, then exposed to a clean-up bull for at least 45 days. Al bulls chosen this year include GAR Sure Fire as the primary sire, and Baldridge Marksman for heifers closely related to Sure Fire.

The Tifton HERD sale will be April 19, 2022.

Virginia BCIA Southwest Bull Test

On-test report (Oct. 26)

Bulls were weighed on test Oct. 26 for the Virginia Beef Cattle Improvement Ass'n (BCIA) Southwest Bull Test at Mountain Spring Farm, Wytheville. The bulls will be fed a silage-based ration targeting an ADG of 3.5 lb.

Bulls in the senior division were born Sept. 1-Dec. 31, 2020. Bulls in the junior division were born Jan. 1-March 31, 2021.

Seventeen producers consigned 48 senior Angus bulls, which weighed an average of 999 lb. at the start of the evaluation. Overall, all 90 bulls averaged 1,025 lb.

The 56 junior Angus bulls,

representing 20 producers, weighed an average of 740 lb. at the start of the test. All 135 junior bulls weighed an average of 746 lb.

Dates for interim weights to be recorded are Dec. 21 and Jan. 18, 2022, with final weights scheduled to be observed Feb. 14-15. The test sale is planned for March 26.
