


Palermo Show grand champion bull, Las Lilas 3221 MM.




Palermo Show reserve grand champion bull, Primavera Gran Noticia 7013.



Palermo Show grand champion female, Sir Williams Royal Pride 636.



Year after year, since 1908, the Angus breed participated again at the Palermo Show, which took place between July 28th and August 17th, organized from its beginnings in 1875, by the Argentine Rural

Society.

"It has been the most important show of the history", declared the President of the Argentine Rural Society, Dr. Guillermo E. Alchouron, due to the quantity of stands relationed with the agriculture, and the excellent qualities of the animals on display corresponding to different species and breeds.


The Corporación Argentina de Aberdeen-Angus organized some activities during the development of this show, like a conference given by Dr. Doyle Wilson, Iowa State University, about the "Angus Sire Evaluation in U.S.A.", to which assisted great quantity of interested breeders in this methodology not still applied in Argentina Angus herds. It was organized too, a new edition of the "Junior Judge", to which assisted more than 100 young enthusiasts. On the other hand, in April, the Corporation initiated a "Judge School", which will finish at the end of 1988. It has been an objective the formation of young people regarding judging and selection of Angus animals. One of the practical classes took place on Monday 15th in this show.

This year, 218 Angus animals were displayed (110 males and 108 females), situating in second place among other beef cattle breeds, with respect to the

number of exhibited animals.

The judging was entrusted to Ing. Horacio F. Gutierrez, owner of the Estancia Tres Marias and Judge in several international shows, like Perth (1971 and 1974), Dallas (1973) and Calgary (1975). In his duty, he preferred such animals which have good muscular development, with good length and excellent poise without the height resulted a determining judgment.

It must be mentioned, that the Angus animals prized in Palermo in the last years, are called "correctors" of our herds. Breeders and specialists affirm that this breed has reached an eminently good size, which must produce in Argentina, only in





an extensive way, with natural or cultivated pastures.

It can be observed that the majority of the winners of each class are sons of American bulls: like Harrison, Pine Drive Big Sky, Winchester, Cobble Pond New Yorker and HAR Bang.


At the 80th showing of Angus at Palermo, great happenings were either born or the winning tradition continued.

The Grand Champion bull exhibited by Comega S.A. marked the first time this outstanding breeding operation was awarded Grand Champion. Comega has obtained several class and division champions throughout the years.

Another first for Jorge Fullone, owner of Sir Williams Angus, Claverack, N.Y., and Oro Negro S.A., was being honored with the Grand Champion Female.

However, La Primavera garnered both Reserve Championships, and for this established breeder, this marked the third year they have exhibited either the Grand or Reserve Grand Championships.
