Foundation Heifer sells Jan. 13

At the NWSS in Denver next month, Angus breeders will have the opportunity to purchase an outstanding female to add to their herd while, at the same time, supporting the future of the Angus breed. The Foundation Heifer Package will be offered at public auction as the kickoff to the National Western Angus Bull Sale, set for Thursday, Jan. 13, at 2 p.m. in the Beef Palace Auction Arena.

This year's package is headlined by Davis Polly 8506, a Jan. '98 daughter of DHD Traveler 6807. Her dam, VDAR Polly 3039, is sired by VDAR New Trend 315. The Foundation Heifer is bred to Sitz SLS Rainmaker 7596, with a projected calving date of March 8, 2000.

This top-quality bred female has been donated by Davis on the Highlands, which is owned by Joe, Sandra, Ashley and Anne Nicole Davis, Springfield, Ky.

In addition to the female, the buyer receives 30 days of insurance from the date of sale from American Livestock Insurance Co., Geneva, Ill.; transportation to the buyer's ranch or farm, provided by Lathrop Livestock Transportation, Dundee, Ill.; a flush and three embryo transplants into the buyer's recipients from Trans Ova Genetics, Sioux Center, Iowa; and Ivomec® provided by Merial.

The sale of the Foundation Heifer Package generates the largest donation to the Angus Foundation granted each year. The Foundation supports youth, education and research for the Angus breed.

Maple Croft Farm earns Historic Herd Award

Maple Croft Farm recently earned the Association's Historic Angus Herd Award, which recognizes herds that have been in the continuous production of Angus cattle by the same family for 50 years or more. A certificate, signed by the president of the Association, has been presented for this achievement.

David and Ruth Davis and their family operate Maple Croft Farm, which is located near Elk Garden, W.Va. The herd was established in 1898 by J.G. Hanlin and was transferred to Clyde and Cora Davis, his daughter and son-in-law, in 1952. In 1976 ownership was then handed to their son and daughter-in-law, David and Ruth.

The first seedstock were purchased from breeders in Ohio and West Virginia. Those original cow families are still represented in the herd, which includes 30 mature females. The farm enrolled in Angus Herd Improvement Records (AHIR) in the early 1960s and has made genetic progress through the program for many years.

The Maple Croft herd also was recognized as a Centennial Angus Herd by the Association in 1983.

Golden Dawn Farms named Historic Angus Herd

Golden Dawn Farms, Carthage, Ind., has been presented the Historic Angus Herd Award by the American Angus Association. The operation is owned by Donald and Sharon Stoten Jr. and their son and daughter-in-law, Brent and Joann Stoten.

The herd was established by Donald Stoten Sr. in 1938 and operated under the name Herkless & Stoten, which was changed to Golden Dawn Farms in the early 1940s. The herd's early seedstock included a heifer named Esther Enchantress that was purchased from Larkin Farms, Shoals, Ind., and served as Donald Jr.'s first 4-H project. They continued to build the herd, mostly by retaining females that were raised. An early herd sire was Miller's Eileenmere 2nd, son of the 1935 International grand champion, Eileenmere 85th, who sired five International champions.

Through the years Golden Dawn has been active in shows and activities and has grown as a family business producing sound, functional cattle that are strong in maternal and fertility traits, volume, and thickness, bred with the commercial market in mind.

A certificate recognizing this achievement has been presented to the Stoten family.
