**Harlan Ritchie,** professor emeritus at Michigan State University, Lansing, was honored as the 2003 International Stockmen's Hall of Fame Inductee during the 2003 International Livestock Congress (ILC) in Houston, Texas, Feb. 27.

Ritchie's contributions as an educator and researcher are among the most respected. He has authored or co-authored 200 scientific or technical articles and has spoken at events in 36 states, seven Canadian provinces, six Australian states, Argentina, Europe and Mexico, according to an ILC news release. He is also a popular judge, who is known for his unbiased and fair assessment of stock.

Ritchie's portrait will hang in the Stockmen's Club of the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo along with the portraits of 34 past recipients.

**Bobby Dale McBride,** Centralia, Mo., has been recognized by the American Angus Association as the recipient of the organization's Historic Angus Herd Award for the longevity of his involvement in the registered Angus business.

McBride founded his herd in 1952 with the purchase of Blades Prizemere Eonda S 5, whose breeding originated from the Fred Blades Angus herd near Holliday, Mo. Several descendants of that foundation cow remain in the herd today. The herd has been enrolled in the Association's Angus Herd Improvement Records (AHIR) program for many years and now uses ultrasound and artificial insemination (AI) to improve genetics.

McBride continues to own and manage the herd today, which consists of approximately 60 Angus females, at his farm near Centralia, Mo. McBride was active in junior Angus programs, and his children and grandchildren have continued to take part in junior activities. He is a longtime member of the Howard County Angus Association and has served as its president; he is also an active member of the Missouri Angus Association.

The Historic Angus Herd Award is presented to active members of the Association who own a herd that has been in the continuous production of registered Angus cattle for 50 years or more by the same person or members of the immediate family.

**Harold Workman,** president and chief executive officer (CEO) of the Kentucky State Fair Board, was inducted into the Saddle and Sirloin Club. His portrait will be hung in the Saddle and Sirloin Portrait Gallery.

Workman oversees the North American International Livestock Exposition (NAILE), National Farm Machinery Show and Kentucky State Fair.


