#### **Fall NCE released this month**

The release of the Fall 2008 National Cattle Evaluation (NCE) is scheduled this month. Watch for new performance data to be posted online by July 14.

The Fall 2008 NCE will include new expected progeny differences (EPDs) that combine carcass and ultrasound performance data. The genetic evaluation produces a single set of EPDs for carcass weight, marbling score, ribeye area and fat thickness. The new EPDs simplify selection tools for commercial bull buyers using Angus genetics by consolidating predictions for animals with carcass and/or ultrasound data. The Fall NCE will also include updated research reports for heifer pregnancy and docility.

The ownership deadline is Aug. 1 for the Angus junior show at the NAILE in Louisville, Ky. The junior exhibitor must be the sole owner of the animal by Aug. 1, as listed on the certificate, and the issue dates on the certificate must reflect the Aug. 1 date.

The entry deadline for the NAILE is Oct. 1. Late entries are never accepted.

The original registration paper is required at check-in. Don't forget to bring your original registration papers, along with your health papers, at check-in. Electronic registrations and copies will not be accepted. Bring the original registration document.
