

## New for the bookshelf

► The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) National Agricultural Library (NAL) has published 2008 editions of its *NAL Agricultural Thesaurus (NALT)* and *Glossary of Agricultural Terms* in both Spanish and English. The update is published collaboratively with the Inter-American Institute for Cooperation in Agriculture (IICA).

The 2008 edition of the *Agricultural Thesaurus and Glossary* adds about 70 new definitions in Spanish and English, with expanded terminology associated with fuels, chocolate manufacture, bodies of water, the U.S. National Forest System and acronyms used in the taxonomic classification of viruses.

The web site features a new format presenting parallel English and Spanish language interfaces, enabling users to search and read all background materials in either language. NAL staff originally prepared the NALT to meet the needs of Agricultural Research Service (ARS) scientists, publishing the first edition Jan. 1, 2002. The thesaurus is now updated each year.

► TRS Publishing Corp. has released *Breeds of Cattle, 2nd Edition*, by Herman Purdy, R. John Dawes and Robert Hough, with revisions by Don Hutzel and a foreword by John Meyer.

Originally released in 1987, the 400-page second edition is completely revised and updated, with expanded text that includes 12 additional breeds, bringing the total to 45. The new book is illustrated with more than 400 color and black-andwhite images.

The book presents phenotype and production statistics for each breed, and provides the addresses and web sites of all major cattle breed associations.

### Large square baler

Massey Ferguson has introduced a new large square baler, the Hesston<sup>®</sup> Series Model 2150. Designed to build 3×3 bales, this baler is for producers who prefer a slightly smaller bale size compared to the company's previously released balers, yet who want a high-capacity machine that builds solid, quality bales efficiently.

The new baler has many new features, including a higher-grade steel, increased flywheel weight and slip clutches. Most sleeves have been replaced with sealed bearings, and roller ball bearings have been replaced with tapered roller bearings for fewer lube points and extended lubrication intervals to save time.

The new baler pickup system has a lower profile four-bar pickup bar that retains more of the hay leaves, and a torsion bar flotation system eliminates crop-catching- and trash-collecting springs. A newly designed hydraulic blower system incorporates a transverse impeller fan that does a better job of keeping the knotter area clean and trouble-free, according to the release.

#### New ergonomically-designed tractor
