Stewart Select Angus LLC, Greensburg, Ind., has been honored with the Historic Herd Award by the American Angus Association.

Arthur Stewart and his sons, Gilman and John, purchased their first Angus cattle in 1954. They joined the Association in 1955 under the name of Stewart & Sons, and the membership later became known as Stewart Seeds Inc. Earlier this fall it became Stewart Select Angus LLC.

Today, the operation is owned by Gilman's son Tom, John's son Jim, and John's son-in-law Steve Gunn. David Smith, who has been with the operation since 1973 and currently sits on the American Angus Association Board of Directors, manages the herd.

The American Angus Association presents the Historic Angus Herd Award to Angus herds that have been in the continuous production of registered Angus cattle by the same family for 50 years or more.

The Murrays exhibited their cattle at shows during their first 15 years in the business as a tool to promote their herd. John served as president of the North Central Iowa Angus Association, and their family hosted its field day.

Ferda Angus Farms, Blackwell, Okla., was recognized with the Historic Herd Award.

Edward Ferda purchased his first Angus cow in 1954. He and his wife, Angeline, managed their Angus herd together until her death in 2004. He still maintains a small herd, as does their daughter, Jaylene Soulek, and her husband, J.D. Registered Angus cattle have been bred and raised since the purchase of Edward's first cow.
