Tom was born April 7, 1910, in Bearwallow, Ky., to T.E. Ballard I and Sally "Sarah" (Auberry) Ballard. He spent his childhood at Cherry Hill farm near Springfield, helping with farm work alongside his siblings.

Tom graduated from high school, where he was a member of the beef judging club. He subsequently got a job working for the state highway department, then for a road building business, where he eventually became partner.

Tom bought the Cherry Hill farm in the 1940s and maintained many other interests, including road construction and coal mining. He married Isabelle Simms McCawley of Springfield Feb. 7, 1946. In 1950, Tom and Isabelle bought a farm near Bardstown and sold Cherry Hill. They maintained a full beef, hog and crop operation on the farm, and later began a separate beef and fowl operation.
