June 15 is your deadline

The June 15 deadline for submitting performance data to be included in the Fall 2007 National Cattle Evaluation (NCE) has added emphasis this year. The Board of Directors of the American Angus Association approved the initial research release of sire heifer pregnancy (HP) expected progeny differences (EPDs) this fall. And June 15 is your deadline for submitting breeding records to be included in this research evaluation, the results of which will be reported separately in a web-based special research report.

Profitability factor

Reproductive traits are undeniably the most important traits to the financial success of a beef cow operation. Increasing feed and fuel costs will only increase the importance of getting cows bred, shortening the calving interval, increasing stayability, reducing cow turnover rates and heifer development costs, and improving the overall efficiency of the cow herd.

With scrotal circumference (SC) already on the books, we can't call heifer pregnancy (HP) the first of our reproductive EPDs, but it is the first to address the cow side of the equation.

The Association now has 40,000 breeding records in house, and the subset of data for heifer pregnancy continues to grow. As noted in "Board Action" reports, the Breed Improvement Committee has been working with staff to oversee the creation and critique of a heifer pregnancy genetic evaluation for quite some time. The Board determined in February that the EPD model was ready and

that the timing was right to run a research evaluation, which will be similar to the initial research evaluations conducted for ultrasound EPDs.

Sally Northcutt, director of genetic research, gives an overview of the HP EPD in this issue's "By the Numbers," column on page 124.

The Board and staff also wanted to give producers another opportunity to submit breeding records prior to this initial evaluation to make it as inclusive as possible. June 15, the same date as the deadline for performance records to be included in the fall 2007 NCE, was selected as the cutoff point.

The release of HP EPDs will be in the format of a web-based special research report listing sire EPDs with a minimum 0.30 accuracy. To contribute data for this project, Angus Herd Improvement Records (AHIRSM) participants can submit breeding records electronically through either AAA Login or the Angus Information

Management Software (AIMS) options, or by requesting printed forms.
