Spring Sire Evaluation Report available

The spring 2006 Sire Evaluation Report will be available online later this month at www.angus.org. Accessing the report online is the fastest and easiest way to get the latest performance information on sires in the Angus breed. It allows you to specify ranges of expected progeny differences (EPDs) and to sort bulls that qualify in those ranges. This evaluation also includes the dollar value indexes (\$Values), expressed in dollars per head, to assist commercial beef producers in selection decisions.

country to Washington, D.C., helps young leaders understand all areas of the beef business, ranging from industry structure to issues management and from production research to marketing. The program is limited to a small number of producers each year, and all participants must be nominated by one of NCBA's affiliate organizations.

The award will include registration costs for the YCC paid directly to NCBA and coach-class airfare from the participant's home to the beginning site of the conference and from the ending site of the conference to the participant's home.

Applicants must be active members of NCBA and active members in good standing of the American Angus Association.

Applicants must be between 25 and 50 years old. Employees of the Association, its subsidiaries or its affiliates are not eligible to apply. Applications are available online at www.angusfoundation.org and should be returned to the Angus Foundation no later than Jan. 6, 2006. Upon receipt, the selection committee will review the application. The YCC nominee will be notified in late February or early March.

- ► March 1 is also the nomination deadline for the Honorary Angus Foundation and Advisor of the Year awards, which are presented during the NJAS.

Breeder's Reference

In keeping with the open policy of the American Angus Association, a "Breeder's Reference" is published periodically in the *Angus Journal* to inform breeders of Angus cattle determined free of genetic defects, those determined carriers of genetic defects or genetic factors, and those determined carriers of nontraditional blood.

The bull Clearwater VRD 1192 (Reg. No. 14212641) was determined to be a carrier of the Class 1 genetic defect syndactyly (mule foot). He was born March 4, 2002.

Rule 300(C), paragraph 2 of the Association Rules, as published in the March 2005 *Breeder's Reference Guide*, states:

Future progeny of animals determined to be carriers of genetic defects or the horn gene are not eligible for registration unless owner members of the affected cow or bull are tested in an Association-approved test that can be supervised by the Association. In the event that such progeny are determined to be free of the genetic defect or specific gene in issue, they will be registered.

Any pedigrees containing carriers of syndactyly have the letter "S" following the registration number to denote the documented defect. A comprehensive "Genetic Defects and Factors" listing will be published in the March 2006 Breeder's Reference Guide and August 2006 issue of the Angus Journal. It was last published in the 2005 Resource Edition inserted in the August issue. Updates are listed in the Angus Journal when available as "Breeder's Reference" listings and can be located via the "Reference" department of the Table of Contents.
