IN PASSING



Ken Odde has been named the head of the Kansas State University (K-State) department of Animal Sciences and Industry. He had been a professor and director of the North Dakota State University's (NDSU's) Beef Systems Center of Excellence since June 2005. Prior to that, Odde served as head of NDSU's Department of Animal and Range Sciences.

Odde earned a bachelor's degree in animal science from South Dakota State University (SDSU) in 1973 and from K-State a master's degree in reproductive physiology, a doctorate in veterinary medicine in 1982, and a doctorate in reproductive physiology in 1983. He has conducted research in such areas as artificial insemination (AI), calving difficulty, endocrine control of postpartum anestrus, estrous synchronization and factors influencing colostrum production.
