► May 1 is the ownership deadline for the Eastern Regional

Junior Angus Show and the ownership deadlines for the Northwest, North Central, and Southwest regional preview junior Angus shows. The entry deadline for these shows is May 15. The National Junior Angus Show (NJAS) ownership deadline is May 15, and the NJAS entry deadline is June 1.

Also note these important dates:

- Certified Angus Beef LLC/National Junior Angus Association (CAB/NJAA) scholarship and Angus Foundation scholarship applications are due May 15.
- June 1 is when NJAS contest entries and Outstanding Leadership Award applications are due.

Spring and summer is full of events like local, state, regional and national Angus shows. Besides showing cattle, these shows also include extra activities such as team sales, cook-off, public speaking and showmanship contests. I encourage you to participate in as many of these contests as you can. Check with your state advisors for state deadlines and participation in the state and national contests.

Meeting dates and deadlines play a major role in student life, and especially in the Angus business. Missing a deadline can lead to disastrous results. So get on the ball, get involved, and, most importantly, meet new people and have fun doing it.

All juniors age 14 and older are eligible to participate. This year's theme is "Achieving Sweet Success." Juniors will have the opportunity to make new Angus friends, learn about current beef industry issues and explore the historic area.

Registration materials can be found in the entry booklet that was distributed to all active juniors earlier in the year. Request materials by contacting the Junior Activities Department or go to *www.njaa.info.* Registration is \$175 for juniors and advisors until June 15, the early registration deadline. After that date, registration will be \$200.

Juniors can submit show entries online

Junior members can save their parents a stamp this spring by submitting their entries for shows online. Simply log on to *www.njaa.info* and provide the necessary information, as well as a Visa or MasterCard number to cover entry and bedding fees.

Online entries are available for the Eastern Regional Junior Angus Show in Raleigh, N.C.; the North Central Regional Preview Junior Angus Show in West Fargo, N.D.; the Northwest Regional Preview Junior Angus Show in Prineville, Ore.; the Southwest Regional Preview Junior Angus Show in Tyler, Texas; and the NJAS in Kansas City, Mo.

Online entries are subject to the same entry deadlines as those submitted via mail, so don't let time slip up on you. As always, no late entries are accepted for any reason.

NIAA members earn Bronze and Silver

The Bronze and Silver awards are the first two levels of the National Junior Recognition Program (NJRP), which the American Angus Association began in 1972. To receive these honors, junior Angus members must apply for the awards and meet point requirements in many areas of participation.

Applicants are evaluated in the areas of junior Angus association activities, participation in showmanship and leadership events, use of performance testing to improve their herds, and progress in producing and merchandising Angus cattle.

While the Bronze and Silver awards are presented to members throughout the year, Angus Productions Inc. (API) publishes summaries of the award winners in the May and September youth-focused issues of the Angus Journal.
