Angus Enthusiasts Travel 'Way Out West'

2005 National Junior Angus Show is set for July 17-23.

lans are well under way for the 2005 National Junior Angus Show (NJAS), set for July 17-23 in Denver, Colo.

The event, "Way out West," is being hosted by several Western states Angus associations. The week-long event, now the largest single-breed beef cattle show in the world, will feature more than 1,000 head of cattle, all exhibited by youth ages 9-21 who are members of the National Junior Angus Association (NJAA).

The cattle show will include divisions for bred-and-owned bulls, heifers and cowcalf pairs, as well as owned heifers, cow-calf pairs and steers. Youth also have the opportunity to enter steers in a carcass contest.

Judges for the cattle show include Randy
Daniel, Colbert, Ga., who will evaluate the owned
females; Vance Uden, Franklin, Neb., who will judge bred-andowned females, bulls and cow-calf pairs; and Mike McGuire,
Waverly, Ala., who will select champions in the steer show.

Educational contests take center stage

In addition to the cattle show, 13 educational competitions take place during the week. Youth compete for top prizes in contests such as prepared and extemporaneous public speaking, quiz bowl, team sales, photography, posters, creative writing and graphic design. Another feature of the week is the American Angus Auxiliary-sponsored All-American *Certified Angus Beef*®

(CAB®) Cook-off. Six members will be elected to the NJAA Board of Directors at the Annual Meeting of the NJAA, hosted during the week.

More than 50 contestants will compete in the 39th annual National Junior Angus

Showmanship Contest. The contest is limited to two participants from each state, and a junior may only compete once. Showmanship judges include Rick Blanchard, Mendota, Calif.; Kathi Creamer, Montrose, Colo.; and Dru Uden, Franklin, Neb.

This year's NJAS will also include several educational opportunities for youth and adults. For the first time, a showmanship clinic will be conducted. This event, set for Tuesday morning,

July 19, will feature past junior Angus members sharing showmanship techniques with the youth before the show even begins. Educational seminar topics will include interpreting and understanding carcass data, as well as fitting and clipping.

Exhibitors and contestants at the NJAS must be junior members of the American Angus Association; they must be 9 years old, but not yet 21, by Jan. 1, 2005, to compete in the activities. The ownership and entry deadline is June 1, and no late entries are accepted.
