Junior deadlines for American Royal, North American

The ownership deadline is Aug. 1 for the Angus junior shows at the American Royal in Kansas City, Mo., and at the NAILE in Louisville, Ky. The junior exhibitor must be the sole owner of the animal by Aug. 1, as listed on the certificate. To be eligible to show, issue dates on the certificates must be Aug. 1 or earlier.

The entry deadline for the American Royal is Sept. 20, and the NAILE deadline is Oct. 1. No late entries will be accepted.

Bull Listing Service offers marketing alternative

Producers looking for an economical way to promote bulls for sale should consider the Bull Listing Service (BLS). Designed with small- and mid-sized producers in mind, but available to anyone selling registered Angus bulls, the BLS lists bulls online for a 90-day period. Each listing includes individual genetic and performance information.

The list, accessed through the "Commercial Programs" link at

www.angus.org, can be sorted

Fitting Rule updated at June Board Meeting

Following discussion by the American Angus Association Board of Directors at their regular meeting in June, an enhanced Rule 11 was unanimously adopted June 10, 2004, to further clarify the "Fitting Rule" adopted at the February 2004 Board meeting. The rule now reads as follows:

Part 3: Association Rules Section IX: Eligibility, conformation and structure of animals presented for exhibition — an overview Rule 11:

Effective July 1, 2004, at any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents on any animal exhibited.

The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated make-up areas.

After July 1, 2004, all shows, open and junior, where the American Angus Association participates with financial support will be governed by this rule.



Members may send their registration papers to the Association to have them converted to electronic storage at no cost between the dates of June 1 and Sept. 30, 2004. After Sept. 30, the fee will be \$2 per paper.
