**Dean Trosper,** 83, Hamilton, Mo., died May 9 at his home.

Dean was born Oct. 8, 1921, in Breckenridge, Mo., to Virgil and Opal O'Neal Trosper. A resident of Caldwell County most of his life, he graduated from the Hamilton high school and served in the Army during World War II.

He married Ina Faye Kavanaugh Oct. 8, 1949, in Hamilton. Dean retired from military service and the Army Reserves as a lieutenant colonel after 33 years of service, and he served as Caldwell County circuit clerk and recorder of deeds for 36 years.

He became a lifetime member of the American Angus Association in the 1950s and was a dedicated supporter of the Missouri Angus Association, the Missouri Junior Angus Association and the National Junior Angus Association (NJAA).

Dean was a member of the Hamilton Masonic Lodge No. 224, the Hamilton American Legion No. 285, and the Moila Shrine and York Rite Masonic Lodge in Saint Joseph, Mo. He was a member of the Pershing chapter of Retired Officers, the 29th Armored Division and chairman of the American Red Cross for 25 years.

He is survived by his wife, sons Michael and Stephen, five grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.

KARL officers for 2005-2006 also include **Gary Cotterill,** Cherryvale, chairman;


