Several herds have earned the American Angus Association's Historic Angus Herd Award. The award recognizes members who have been in the continuous production of registered Angus cattle by the same individual or family for 50 years or more.

- ▶ Dwayne Mathews, Danville, Iowa. Mathews started the herd in 1953 with the purchase of four cows from Keith Nau of Mount Pleasant, Iowa. Mathews joined the Association in 1955 and still manages a herd of 20 cows.
- ➤ Wiederin Angus, Carroll, Iowa. Carl Wiederin started the herd in 1944 and became an Association member in 1951. Ownership has been passed down through the family, and Patrick Wiederin now owns the herd.
- ► Marcy Cattle Co., Hay Springs, Neb. Although the farm was interrupted by

World War II, it resumed production and was re-established in 1951 with the purchase of Angus cattle from Nebraska and Illinois. Established by Jay Marcy and his sons, Charles and Orrin, the herd operated under the name of Jay Marcy & Sons until 1961, when it changed to Marcy Bros., and, finally, Marcy Cattle Co. in 1983. The herd has grown to a 300-head cow-calf operation, completing its 43rd annual bull sale with 140 bulls this year.

Marcy Cattle Co. is currently run by Tom and Kim Marcy, Hay Springs, Neb.; George and Ann Marcy, Fort Collins, Colo.; and Charles and Barbara Marcy, Chadron, Neb.

▶ Richard and Vivian Pierce, Stratton, Neb. The Pierces started the herd in 1950 with the purchase of a registered Angus bull from High Plains Angus. They joined the Association in 1953, and in 1963 they helped organize the Southwest Nebraska Angus Association in McCook. The original name of the operation was RV Angus, but it was changed to Pierce Angus Ranch in 1970.

They have attended numerous Angus tours in Hawaii, England and Scotland. Their herd currently consists of 25 registered Angus cows and is managed by Chase Beeby of Lebanon.

▶ John B. Hopkins & Son, Auxvasse, Mo. John and Helen Hopkins started the herd and joined the Association in 1954, when their son Rick was a baby. The first cattle purchased came from Central Missouri Angus Association, Audrain County Angus Association and County Line Angus Farm. The Hopkins have produced numerous champions, including three grand champion steers at the Missouri State Fair. The farm name has since changed to Edgewood Angus Farm. Rick Hopkins now owns and manages the herd of 35 cows.

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- ▶ Carl Miller, Saint Anthony, N.D. Today, Miller, his wife, Margaret, and their family manage a herd of more than 160 registered cows.


