Association members to meet at 121st Annual Meeting.

embers of the American Angus Association and Angus enthusiasts from across the nation will gather at the 2004 North American International Livestock Exposition (NAILE), Nov. 13-16 in Louisville, Ky. A full schedule of events is planned for attendees of the American Angus Association's 121st Annual Meeting of the membership and the 2004 Super-Point Roll of Victory (ROV) Angus Show, which has been designated as this year's National Angus Show.

The Annual Meeting will begin at 2 p.m. Monday, Nov. 15, at the Kentucky Fair and Exposition Center (KFEC) and is open to all Association members. President Joe Elliott, Adams, Tenn., will preside over the meeting. A total of 366 delegates from 47 states, the District of Columbia and Canada will conduct the business of the Association, including electing officers and five directors. Profiles of this year's candidates are found on page 146, and a list of the delegates and alternates starts on page 154.

During the Annual Meeting, the Association's Annual Report will be presented and distributed to the membership. In addition, reports

will be given on the activities of Angus Productions Inc. (API), Certified Angus Beef LLC (CAB) and the Angus Foundation.

National Angus Show

In addition to the meetings in Louisville, the 2005 National Angus Show will take place during the super-point ROV show, Nov. 15-

16. A father-son team will evaluate the cattle, with Gary Dameron, Lexington, Ill., serving as the lead judge. His son, Jeff Dameron, Normal, Ill., will be the associate judge.

Bulls and cow-calf pairs will show Monday, Nov. 15. The females and group classes will show Tuesday, Nov. 16. Both shows start at 8 a.m., in Freedom Hall at the KFEC.

In addition to the super-point ROV show, a junior heifer show will take place Sunday, Nov. 14. The order of breeds is not announced until Saturday, so check at the registration desk at the Executive West for the approximate show time.

Educational opportunities

The American Angus Association will present a breeders' informational forum that will begin at 1 p.m., Sunday, Nov. 14, in the KFEC South Wing. Everyone is encouraged to attend.

The open meeting for the Association Board candidates and delegates will immediately follow the informational forum. Each candidate will have the opportunity to introduce himself to the members present, and delegates are encouraged to ask questions.

Scott Johnson, director of Angus Information Management Software (AIMS), will offer educational workshops on AIMS and other computer basics.

On Sunday, Nov. 14, a basic computer workshop for Windows® users will take place from 8-9 a.m. at the Executive West. This

> workshop will not discuss the AIMS program, but will focus on using Windows in everyday computer applications.

An AIMS workshop for new users will be that afternoon from 4:30-6 p.m. at the Executive West. The workshop will be an interactive format where users can ask questions and see a live demonstration of the software.

On Monday, Nov. 15, Johnson will lead a more advanced AIMS workshop featuring Crystal Report Writer. This session will be in Room 107 of the KFEC South Wing.
